1. Executive Summary

During the Even Semester, from January to April 2025, the Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, IFHE, Hyderabad, organized a series of impactful legal awareness and aid programs across various districts of Telangana. These initiatives were conducted with the invaluable guidance and support of our esteemed Director, Prof. (Dr.) P. Ravisekararaju, and Prof. Y. Pratap Reddy, Dean of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad. A dedicated team of faculty and students worked diligently to disseminate legal knowledge to marginalized and underprivileged communities. To ensure effective teamwork, regular meetings were held, and the entire team demonstrated exceptional dedication and commitment throughout the semester, effectively managing their availability to meet program requirements.

The members of the Legal Aid Society who participated in these initiatives developed proficiency in public speaking, learned to create engaging posters, and engaged in innovative activities to spread legal knowledge. They interacted with the public, identified key individuals, secured appointments, and refined their data collection and interviewing skills. Consequently, the legal aid team was well-equipped to implement various legal awareness programs.

A total of four legal awareness and aid programs were conducted during this semester. The first program took place in Gattuboothkur Village, Gangadhara Mandal, Karimnagar District, focusing on farmers' rights in collaboration with Karimnagar's District Level Services Authority (DLSA). The second program was organized in Sangareddy District, addressing legal awareness regarding the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, in partnership with DLSA Sangareddy District. The third program was held in Nagarkurnool District, targeting medical and agricultural college students, in cooperation with DLSA Nagarkurnool. Finally, a legal aid camp for gig and platform workers was conducted in Hyderabad City, in collaboration with the DLSA and the Session Court of Hyderabad.

The themes for the speed mentoring program were carefully curated in collaboration with the Headmaster and Principal of the school on Child Trafficking. Dr. K.V. Ravi Kumar delivered a speech focusing on the rescue, rehabilitation, and reintegration of trafficked children. The program also featured a poster presentation that discussed the various ways children are trafficked and how they can protect themselves, there was a quiz game focused on various facts related to International and National Child Traffic Day. The students participated enthusiastically and gained a better understanding of the situations surrounding child trafficking and the importance of the Child Helpline number 1098.

The core team and Faculty Coordinator conducted visits to various villages to engage with the community and gain insights into their socio-legal challenges. Following these discussions, we selected themes for our street plays. Two street play programs were organized: the first aimed at raising awareness about the fundamental duties enshrined in the Indian Constitution, coinciding with Republic Day celebrations in Prodattur Village. The second program focused on the critical issue of drug abuse and took place in Gopularam Village. These initiatives not only helped promote legal awareness but also fostered community participation and dialogue on pressing social issues.

The research on gig and platform workers was conducted in January, and the corresponding research paper was prepared and presented at Gujarat National Law University in Gandhi Nagar for a Legal Aid Grant. Our presentation received appreciation for both its analysis and

delivery. Additionally, faculty members participated in a roundtable conference aimed at establishing a Legal Aid Consortium in India, with ICFAI Law School serving as a key member of this national initiative.

Sri Ch. Panchakchari, the Member Secretary of the Telangana State Legal Services Authority, visited our campus to deliver a guest lecture on NALSA schemes and Lok Adalat. During his visit, he also launched the ICFAI Free Legal Aid web form, which is designed for the poor and marginalized community. This voice-recognized form enables even those who are illiterate to fill it out easily. The Member Secretary visited the Legal Aid Clinic of the ICFAI Law School and praised the initiatives undertaken by the Legal Aid Society.

Faculty members of the Legal Aid Society served as resource persons in an orientation training program tailored to equip members of the specialized Legal Services Unit, MANONYAY, as well as those working with children under the NALSA (National Legal Services Authority) initiatives. This specifically included the Child-Friendly Legal Services for Children Scheme and the Legal Services for Persons with Mental Illness and Intellectual Disabilities Scheme—2025. The aim of this training was to provide essential knowledge and practical skills necessary for effective legal service delivery.

Furthermore, the Legal Aid Society team from ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, won the first prize in the second edition of Vidhiutsav, the National Legal Aid Clinic Excellence Award, organized by UPES Dehradun. The team consisted of Mr. P. V. Saikushal and Mr. S. Venkat, both fourth-year students in the B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) program, who excelled in their offline presentation. Their success stemmed from their impressive understanding of legal aid issues and innovative solutions. This achievement highlights not only their commitment to legal excellence but also the significant role of ICFAI Law School in cultivating future leaders in the legal field. This recognition is for the legal aid activities carried out during 2024.

I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to our Director, Dean, and all faculty members for their support and cooperation in organizing various legal aid programs. We also appreciate the ongoing support and funding from the IFHE Management for our legal aid initiatives. Additionally, I would like to thank the faculty team, including Dr. K.V. Ravi Kumar, Dr. P. Kesari, and Ms. Thejaswini Srikanth, for their generous support, as well as heartfelt thanks to the Legal Aid student team for their constant efforts to disseminate legal knowledge to the marginalized and underprivileged.



The play addressed issues such as education, environmental pollution, and superstitious beliefs, with the audience actively participating by pledging to uphold these duties. At the end of the street play, every participant read the preamble to promote unity in the society.



4. Legal Awareness Camp on Farmers' Rights in Karimnagar District



The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School at IFHE, Hyderabad, organized a legal awareness camp on Farmers' Rights in collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority of Karimnagar on February 1, 2025, in Gattuboothkur Village, Gangadhara Mandal, Karimnagar.



The initial meeting was held with Sri K. Venkatesh, Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority, Karimnagar District

Prof. Y. Pratap Reddy, Dean of ICFAI Law School, welcomed the guests, legal aid counsels, and farmers. He explained the camp's purpose, emphasizing the importance of awareness regarding one's rights and responsibilities. The Chief Guest, Shri B. Prathima, Principal District and Sessions Judge of Karimnagar, spoke to the farmers about various legislations designed to help improve their socio-economic conditions. She addressed the critical issue of farmer suicides, highlighting the importance of mental health support, financial security, and government intervention in preventing such tragedies.

The Guest of Honor, Sri K. Venkatesh, Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority, Karimnagar, discussed essential laws such as the Bhu Bharathi Act, the Bhu Aadhar Number, and the Easements Act. He also warned about the rising incidents of cyber fraud targeting rural communities, urging farmers to be cautious of financial scams and to verify sources before engaging in online transactions.

Judges from the Karimnagar District Court also attended, including Smt. P. Sarala Rekha, 3rd AJCJ cum Spl. JMFC for trial cases; Ms. Damarla Preethi, I Additional Junior Civil Judge cum I Additional Judicial Magistrate of First Class (Juvenile Court); and Sri D. Venkatesh, I Addl. District and Sessions Judge cum (in-charge) Spl. Sessions Judge for FTC for POCSO cases. They spoke about the rights of women laborers, insurance, and child protection.

Special invitees, including Sri Ch. V.S. Janadhana Rao, District Education Officer, Karimnagar; K. Maheswar, RDO, Karimnagar; and Sri B. Ramanarao, Chairman of Bhagavathi Group of Schools, also attended the legal awareness camp and interacted with farmers.

Legal Aid members presented posters illustrating farmers' rights under various laws, including the Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmers' Rights Act (PPV FRA) of 2001, the Rythu Bheema, and the Bandhu scheme. They highlighted the toll-free number (1800-200-1001) for farmers to register grievances.



To engage the audience, the Legal Aid members performed a drama portraying two farmers struggling with drought, debt, and personal hardships. The characters inspired the farmers to adopt better agricultural practices through education and technology, delivering a message of hope that encouraged farmers to seek solutions rather than succumb to despair.



Prof. Pratap Reddy presented mementos to all the judges and special invitees who attended the event. Dr. K.V. Ravikumar delivered the vote of thanks. The Legal Awareness Camp at Karimnagar proved to be an enlightening session for farmers and community members, equipping them with essential legal knowledge. The discussions covered various topics, including farmers' economic rights, women's empowerment, child protection, cyber security, insurance policies, and land laws.



The event concluded with an interactive session where farmers and attendees could seek legal clarifications from the esteemed panel. The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, remains committed to conducting more awareness programs in the future, ensuring

that legal knowledge reaches the grassroots level and empowers individuals to exercise their rights effectively. The event covered in local news media.

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
5. Participated in NALSA Reel making Competition

6. Speed Mentoring on Child Trafficking in ZPHS Janwada



The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School at IFHE, Hyderabad, organized a speed mentoring program on child trafficking at Zilla Parishad High School in Janwada village, Shankarpally Mandal, Ranga Reddy District. This program aimed to raise awareness about child protection mechanisms for students in grades 8 to 10.



Dr. K.V. Ravi Kumar delivered a speech focusing on the rescue, rehabilitation, and reintegration of trafficked children. He highlighted that thousands of children are trafficked each year from rural, tribal, and urban areas in India. These victims are treated as commodities, losing their childhoods due to the severe issue of child trafficking. Their basic rights—regardless of economic status, caste, or gender—are stripped away. Traffickers exploit children's less developed mental capacities, making it difficult for them to discern right from wrong or articulate their trauma compared to adults. As a result, children become easy targets. This practice deprives them of the love and care of their families, exposing them to violence,

abuse, and traumatic conditions. There is an urgent need to create awareness and educate people about the realities of child trafficking.



The next segment of the program included a poster presentation discussing the various ways children are trafficked, the reasons behind trafficking, and the human rights violations that make it a global offense. It shed light on the seriousness of girl child trafficking and emphasized the importance of spreading awareness about how to respond when encountering such situations. Students were informed about the Child Helpline number 1098 and the assistance mechanisms available in Telangana.



An engaging card activity was conducted, involving students from classes 8 to 10 in an interactive learning experience about child trafficking. Each student picked a card depicting a realistic trafficking scenario, analyzed it, and discussed possible ways to identify, prevent, and

assist victims. Through creative storytelling and critical thinking, students underscored the urgent need to protect vulnerable children. The activity reinforced the powerful message: "Leave No Child Behind." Students pledged to raise awareness, take a stand against child exploitation, and become advocates for child safety in their communities.



Finally, a quiz game focused on facts related to International and National Child Traffic Day was organized. The students participated enthusiastically and gained a better understanding of the issues surrounding child trafficking and the importance of the Child Helpline number 1098.



ICFAI Law School Conducts Speed Mentoring Program on Child Trafficking Awareness

The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, IFHE, Hyderahad, organized a Speed Mentoring program on child trafficking at Zilla Parishad High School in Janwada Village, Shankarpally Mandal, Ranga Reddy District. Dr. K.V. Ravi Kumar addressed the students, highthe rescue. rehabilitation, and reintegration of trafficked children. He emphasized that thousands of children are trafficked each year across India from rural, tribal, and urban areas, often losing their childhoods to exploitation. These victims are treated as commodities, stripped of their fundamental rights regardless of economic status, caste, or gender. Dr.



Ravi Kumar stressed that traffickers take advantage of children's underdeveloped mental capacity, making them vulnerable targets. He further underscored the need for widespread awareness to prevent child trafficking and safeguard children's rights.

As part of the program, a poster presentation was conducted, educating students on various trafficking methods and self-protection strategies. The children were also informed about the Child Helpline number 1098 and the support systems available in Telangana. To reinforce their understanding, a card game

was organized where students picked scenarios related to child trafficking, explained them, and discussed potential solutions.

The program concluded with a quiz focused on facts related to International and National Child Traffic Day. The interactive session saw enthusiastic participation from students, helping them better grasp the seriousness of child trafficking and the importance of the Child Helpline.

The event was coordinated by Dr. S. Kannan, along with members of the Legal Aid Society at ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad.
