The program organised in collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) of Ranga Reddy District and ANKITA NGO from Bandlaguda, Hyderabad, organized a Legal Aid Camp for construction workers on December 18, 2024. The event was held at the Community Hall in Ganesh Nagar Colony, Shankarpally Mandal, Ranga Reddy District. The camp aimed to support construction workers by distributing BOCW (Building and Other Construction Workers) cards, which are essential documents that provide access to various government welfare benefits under the Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996.

Every registered construction worker under this act is entitled to numerous benefits provided by the Telangana Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board. With the BOCW card, workers can access benefits such as marriage gifts, maternity benefits, relief for fatal accidents, disability relief (both total and partial), natural death relief, hospitalization relief, funeral expenses, skill development training, vocational training for dependents, relief for unregistered workers, and disability aids and appliances. The details of benefits were given below:

Benefits to Labour Card Holders

As per the provisions of the Building & Other Construction Workers (RE&CS) Act, 1996, every building & construction worker registered as a beneficiary under this Act is entitled to avail benefits under following schemes formulated by TELANGANA Building & Other Construction Workers Welfare Board.
