program focused on elderly rights. We covered almost a 1 km radius around the primary school in the village and received a positive response from the elderly community.

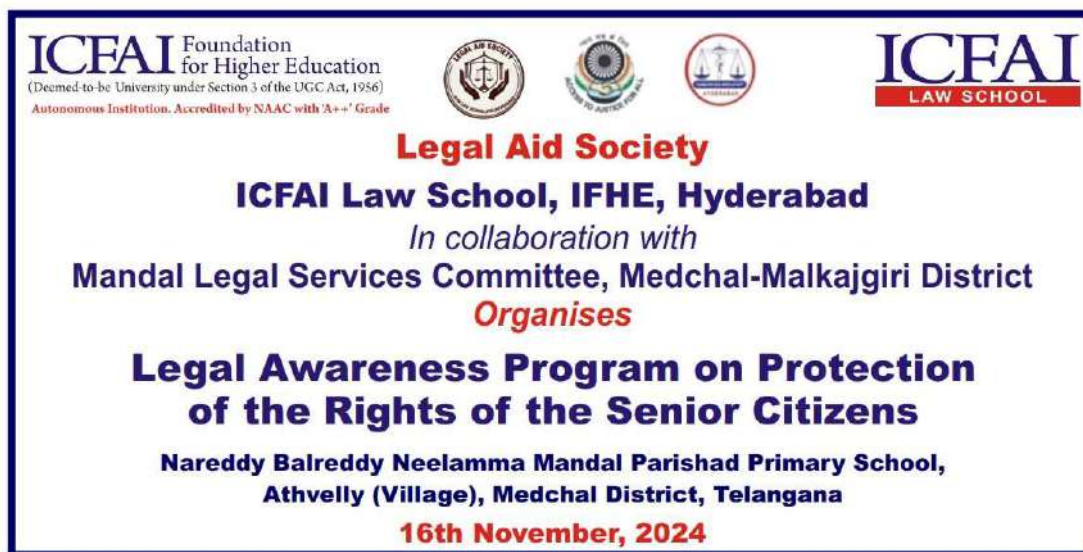

We also invited the Mandal Revenue office, Smt. Sailja Madam, the Circle Inspector, Sr. A. Satyanarayana, the Mandal Education Officer, and the school principal, Mr. Srinivas Rao, to attend the programme.





The event was held at the Mandal Parishad Primary School in Athvelly Village, located in the Medchal Malkajgiri District. Prof. Y. Pratap Reddy, the Dean of ICFAI Law School, inaugurated the session. He welcomed the guests and praised the legal aid members for their outreach initiatives in Athvelly Village. He emphasized that children or legal heirs are legally obligated to provide basic financial and emotional support to parents and senior citizens who are unable to support themselves. The Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, is a significant piece of legislation in India that ensures the welfare of elderly individuals by making it a legal responsibility for children and relatives to provide for their maintenance.



The Chief Guest for the program was J. Jeevan Kumar, the Additional District and Sessions Judge and Chairman of the Mandal Legal Services Committee at the Medchal Court. He addressed the senior citizens in attendance, offering valuable insights into the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007. He elaborated on the legal provisions designed to ensure the well-being of the elderly and emphasized the importance of protecting their rights.

Furthermore, he specified that while many government initiatives are commendable, true change relies on the collective efforts of individuals, families, and communities. He urged citizens to resolve to:

- Treat our elders with the dignity and respect they deserve.
- Create an environment where senior citizens feel safe and valued.
- Volunteer and support organizations that work for the welfare of the elderly.
- Advocate for stronger enforcement of laws and policies to safeguard the rights of senior citizens.

The welfare of our senior citizens is not just a legal responsibility; it is a moral and ethical obligation.

The Guest of Honour, Dilip Kumar, the 9th Magistrate Metropolitan Judge at Medchal Court, highlighted various government assistance schemes available for senior citizens. He emphasized the need for increased awareness and accessibility regarding these programs intended to support the elderly population.

Poster presentation by Chakrika and Tapaswi- BALLB (Hons.)7th semester

The Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 was enacted to ensure that the elderly are provided with adequate resources and care by their families and the government. If a senior citizen transfers property (via will, gift deed, or other means) on the condition of being cared for but is later neglected, the transfer can be declared void. Maintenance tribunals resolve property disputes within a fixed timeframe.



Both central and state governments have introduced several welfare schemes for the elderly to provide financial, healthcare, and social security.

1. Ayushman Bharat (Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana): Provides health insurance coverage of up to ₹5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary hospitalization.

Telangana State Government Schemes

1. Aasara Pension: A welfare scheme providing pensions to the elderly, widows, and disabled individuals. Eligible senior citizens receive a monthly pension of ₹2,016.
2. Cheyutha Scheme: Focused on the welfare of vulnerable groups, including senior citizens. Provides financial support and healthcare assistance to enhance their quality of life.

Drama by Sri Kavya & team from BBALLB (Hons.) 3rd semester:

The story opens with a happy family scene where elderly parents, Ramayya and Seethamma, express pride in their son, Raghava, whom they raised with love and sacrifice. One day, Raghava convinces his father to transfer all family property to his name, citing future security. Despite initial hesitation, Ramayya agrees, trusting his son.

However, once the transfer is complete, Raghava and his wife start neglecting and disrespecting the elderly couple, eventually forcing them out of the house. Heartbroken, Ramayya and Seethamma seek help from Ramanna, an old friend. Ramanna advises them to invoke the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act and file a police complaint. The case goes to court, where the judge orders the property returned to the parents, emphasizing the legal and moral obligation of children to care for their parents. Raghava, filled with regret, realizes his mistake.



The story concludes with a message highlighting the importance of love, respect, and legal protections for senior citizens, urging society to ensure their dignity and well-being.

Speech by Sri Meedha and Nithin Reddy – BBALLB (Hons.) 9th Semester

The Senior Citizens' Welfare and Protection Act, 2007 came into effect in the erstwhile Andhra Pradesh in 2008. The main objective of the Act is to safeguard the rights of senior citizens and provide maintenance for parents and senior citizens.



The Act establishes tribunals at the district level to address grievances from senior citizens and parents regarding abandonment or neglect by their children or relatives. Disputes will be resolved within a timeframe of 120 days to one year. According to the provisions of the Act, a maintenance amount of ₹10,000 can be granted to senior citizens and parents.

The event concluded with interactions between legal aid members and senior citizens, during which participants shared their challenges and issues. This event underscored the commitment of ICFAI Law School's Legal Aid Society's commitment to advocate for senior citizens' rights, promote legal literacy, and ensure the well-being of the elderly in the community. The event was also published in Pioneer, Deccan Vision, Sakhi, Enadu and NTV news media.
