4. Executive summary

The Youth Peer V.A. Malles Legal Aid Commission successfully enhanced legal services for women and communities, focusing particularly on empowering women leaders at the grassroots level. This initiative not only aimed to improve access to justice but also sought to strengthen the role of women in leadership positions within their communities. By providing essential legal training and resources, the commission fostered a supportive environment for women to advocate for their rights and the rights of others, creating a ripple effect of social change and empowerment throughout the region.

We encountered several challenges due to the duty of the local judges: divisions in Talagapan, which ultimately took place in mid-November. After the session, the students went to other sessions. However, the legal professionals remained committed to their studies and continued to work diligently throughout the week. Their dedication paid off as they successfully prepared and delivered their high-quality projects during the week, each tackling important legal issues and engaging in discussions relevant to our community. The students also worked simultaneously and completed their final work.

The peer-teaching team was given the overall task of preparing their projects well in advance. They dedicated their entire weekend to this project, demonstrating their creativity and commitment. As a result, the final work submissions were completed smoothly, showcasing the team's hard work and collaborative spirit. Additionally, some female students in attendance participated, as the topic is related to women's legal issues.

Despite this success, the primary challenge lay in identifying women organizers and local resources in specific locations. In neighboring villages, even local political elections recently completed, we were concerned about engaging with several women organizers. However, gathering a total of 100 women organizers proved to be more challenging than anticipated, as the team faced issues related to visibility and accessibility within their communities.

The dedicated legal aid team had the opportunity to meet with the women's president of the Talagapan Women's Organizing Federation in Marikudo, Davao. During this meeting, she expressed her appreciation for our initiatives and highlighted the importance of empowering women in leadership roles. In a promising development, she agreed to assist with a special mentoring program focused on the roles and functions of the Women's Rights Commission. This support aims to provide valuable insights and guidance to ongoing women leaders in the region.

This collaboration not only enhances our outreach efforts but also strengthens the support network for women in local government. We provided us with the contact information for the neighboring village organizers and the list of local resources to reach out to. Consequently, the special mentoring team, led by Ms. Laryngale, organized the event in Chirital village, making it a great success. Many participants found the program highly informative and noted the solid numbers provided. Additionally, feedback on the functioning of the network, team, and document review & recommendations were distributed to all participants. The program became great success.

Legal Aid encompasses a wide range of activities to promote social justice by using the law as a powerful tool. The current legal profession primarily focuses on improving the quality of legal services rather than ensuring fair and equal access. This is where the concept of Legal Aid plays a crucial role. It aims to make the law accessible to individuals who are often overlooked and do not receive proper legal support.

At the Legal Aid Society of Illinois Law School, Urbana-Champaign, we strive to promote legal awareness and provide assistance to those who cannot afford professional legal services, while also advocating for public causes that often lack adequate support. Since its establishment in 1914, the Club has expanded numerous legal aid services, consumer protection camps, and legal awareness programs in nearby villages. Our Legal Aid Services have consistently been a reliable support system for those needing legal assistance. Our success in this field results from the exceptional efforts of our students, faculty, and lawyers guided by legal aid principles. Our main objectives include raising awareness, offering support, and ensuring fair and equitable access to all facets of the legal process.

Education, Diversity, Health, and Mental Wellbeing—expanding Legal Aid and awareness programs for marginalized communities. The primary focus of these programs was on women's empowerment, unorganized workers, 4 authors of E-Straw youth, and BOCV staff for construction workers, gig and platform workers, street vendors, and school children.

Each participant was provided with help/information specifically designed for equipping business and writing support, activities were encouraged to display their business or their local products within shops to create easy access for all community members. Additionally, the programs highlighted the availability of free legal aid services under District Legal Services Authority (DLDA) office located within the District Court complex.

In addition to these initiatives, the Legal Aid Society also organized special awareness sessions for schoolchildren, focusing on child rights and protection. We conducted street plays and rallies that were addressing various socio-legal issues. Furthermore, we produced Legal Aid posters that explained contemporary legal topics and provided guidance for Legal Aid initiatives. Legal Aid sessions were also encouraged to participate in campaigns to increase the activities organized by the society.

1. Street play on Fundamental Rights and Right to Vote on 18th August 2019 in Irritants Thanda Gram Panchayat, Shankaragilly Mandal, Rang Reddy District, Telangana



On 18th August 2019, students from KCFAL Law School visited Irritants Thanda, Shankaragilly Mandal, Rang Reddy District, to conduct an awareness program on the Right to Vote. The event aimed to educate the villagers on the importance of voting as a democratic right and responsibility.



The team reached the Gram Panchayat office at 10:30 a.m., where preparations for the show were already underway. The Vice President of the Congress Party, Siva Dal arrived shortly after. The program commenced at around 1:00 p.m. with traditional musical bonding as an act of bonding towards the neighborhood, followed by the participation of many of our students in the skit. The students actively were the process, adding to the significance of the event.

Following the flag hoisting, Dr. G.V. Sanku Kumar, addressed the gathering, emphasizing voter guidance to the voters and a brief reflection on India's constitutional provisions. He went on to explain the concept of equality before the law, the six fundamental rights, and, in particular, the right to vote. His address highlighted how every citizen's vote plays a crucial role in shaping the nation.



The announcement expressed, led by, Chief, mentioned a joint presentation by Shree and Shriya. Shree explained the show behind the scenes and its relevance to the village, while Shriya discussed on the socio-political context.

The main highlight of the program was the live performance. It began with the participants forming a circle, symbolizing unity, and delivering the message "Your vote is your weapon - use it to protect the nation" and "Your future depends on your vote - don't waste it." The first performance occurred this year in a single year and being simple.



The presence of the teachers and opening Rayank added value to the outreach efforts. The village's engagement and positive response affirmed that the message resonated in authentic lives of the people present. They also took up the opportunity to express their views on rights to vote relating to the understanding.



Conclusion

The visit by IISIL Law School students successfully spread awareness about the right to vote, encouraging villages to register their vote in democracy. The program reinforced the belief that every vote counts and the commitment of the nation's progress. The outreach program concluded with a sapling plantation drive and interactive sessions with villages, promoting both environmental sustainability and a renewed sense of civic responsibility.





On August 02, 2023, the Legal Aid Center of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, successfully organized a comprehensive legal awareness program centered on consumer rights and protection in the Mahabubnagar District. Anandika, the President of the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, along with other distinguished members of its commission, all of whom coordinated their respective to the program. The primary objective was to enhance public understanding of consumer rights as defined in the Consumer Protection Act of 2019, which aims to safeguard consumer interests in modern economies.



Participants were informed about essential consumer, including the National Consumer Helpline (1818) and the toll-free number (1800-11-4000) for registering grievances, noting that another was aware of its support available in Hindi in case of non-communicated issues. The program featured a compelling poster presentation that highlighted the key rights of consumers, particularly the right to return, and provided

guidance on the procedure for effectively seeking redress. A theatrical performance dramatically illustrating consumer rights was a standout feature of the event, engaging attendees and facilitating a deeper understanding of their entitlements in various consumer scenarios.

A Legal Aid Desk was established to assist consumers who attended the program with their queries and concerns. Legal professionals and representatives from the Mahabubnagar Consumer Commission were on hand to provide valuable insights and guidance. Furthermore, the event provided a unique opportunity for participants to engage directly with the Hon'ble President of the Consumer Redressal Commission, fostering an interactive environment where consumers could raise questions and clear their queries.



Overall, the program was impactful, successfully reaching six parishes with significantly rising awareness about consumer safety, rights, and protection within the community. The event not only educated consumers but also empowered them to advocate for their rights confidently.

3. Legal aid members volunteered in the National Lok Adalat held on 13th September 2015 in Telangana

The National Lok Adalat took place in Telangana across various levels, from the High Court to the Taluk level, on September 13, 2015. The initiative aimed to settle civil and compoundable criminal cases, summarily try pre-trial and pending litigation. Lok Adalat was established to promote amicable between the parties involved, based on mutual consent. Furthermore, the awards issued by a Lok Adalat are recognized as orders of a civil court, making them enforceable. Officers of the legal aid team from ICPALL Law School actively participated by assisting legal counsels in resolving disputed cases. They contributed in multiple courts, including the Ranga Reddy District Court, City Civil Court Secunderabad, City Civil Court in Warangal, as well as in Jagtial District, Karimnagar District, and Kalyandurg Court, Mahabub-Nalgonda district. The experience provided law students with practical insights into case resolution while allowing them to contribute to society by promoting legal resolution.

4. Speed mentoring program centered on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012 on 11th September 2023 at ZPIIS, Tangraur

Approximately 75 students from the 10th and 11th grades participated in the event. During the program, faculty members discussed various provisions of the POCSO Act,



regarding child sexual abuse and the penalties imposed on offenders. The legal aid team presented an informative power-pointing how to report instances of sexual abuse to parents, the police, and the child disciplinary committee. Justice was also shared on the concept of "Good Touch" and "Bad Touch," highlighting the importance of vigilance in recognizing and addressing inappropriate or disturbing behaviors.



The presentation also covered the signs of drug abuse and its ramifications. In a serious segment, students performed a skit and dramatizing how they can prevent domestic violence and address by calling the state helpline number, 1028, and the police helpline number, 100. Student feedback indicated a strong comprehension of the POCSO Act's provisions. The program concluded with an engaging activity that encouraged students to share their insights from the session. The POCSO Act underscores

the importance of recognizing signs in the form of sexual abuse, students are urged to report any incidents immediately to their parents, law enforcement, or school authorities. This event was made possible through funding from IITM Management, aimed at promoting legal literacy in Telangana. The event is organized by Dr. R. K. The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School at ICFAR, Hyderabad, organized a legal awareness program for and on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012, at Sejalika School in Mirzapur district, Uttar Pradesh, on October 16, 2021. Students from the 6th to 11th grades, around 120 students, participated in the program. Faculty members discussed various provisions of the Act related to child sexual abuse, including rape and sexual assault, as well as the penalties for offences.

During the program, faculty members underscored the importance of POCSO Act and emphasized the importance of consent and respecting personal boundaries among children and teens. It explained grooming and manipulation, helping students recognize warning signs of child sexual abuse. The talk guided them on how to respond and report such situations confidently. Finally, it highlighted the role of teachers and adults in creating a culture of safety, trust, and respect for every child.

Legal aid members prepared a poster outlining the process for reporting abuse, share it parents, the police, and the school and filing a complaint. Additionally, students performed a skit set to raise awareness about child abuse, demonstrating how children can report through a helpline number (1025), the police helpline number (100), and the POCSO helpline under the National Centre for the Protection of Child Rights. A group activity centered on being aware and able to make the world more safer for the children.

The Legal Aid Society, ICFAI Law School (IJWE) Hyderabad, in collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority of Kamareddy District, organized a Legal Awareness Program on the JAGRITI (Justice Awareness for Grassroots Information and Transparency Initiative) Scheme, 2022, along with a Jan Sewai for women MGNREGA workers and Self-Help Group (SHG) members. This event took place on November 9, 2022, at Rythu Vardha Hall in Gopantopad Thanda, Kamareddy District, Kamareddy District, Telangana.

This legal awareness program is conducted on National Legal Services Day (NLSD), which is observed annually on November 9. The purpose of this day is to spread awareness about ensuring fair and equal access to justice for all citizens, as well as to promote awareness of citizens' rights under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987.

The program commenced with a welcome address by Dr. K.V. Sarin, Justice (Retiree) of ICFAI Law School, IJWE Hyderabad. In his speech, he mentioned ICFAI Law School and highlighted the importance of the Legal Aid Society. He emphasized the importance of spreading legal awareness among workers and citizens and explained how the Legal Aid Society guides and assists them about their rights and use the same in accessing various institutions. Such initiatives empower individuals, particularly vulnerable groups, by promoting justice and fairness.

The chief guest of the program is Mr. T. Vignesh, Senior Civil Judge and Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority, Kamareddy District. In his speech, the Secretary of the DLSD focused on the JAGRITI scheme, explaining the availability of free legal aid services for women and children, members of the Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST), industrial workers, victims of natural disasters, violence, or industrial accidents, persons with disabilities, individuals in custody, those below the guaranteed income limit, and victims of trafficking or forced labor.

The event was held at Meazure Learning in Hyderabad, Telangana, on November 30th, 2018. The program was highly interactive, with employees actively participating by asking questions and sharing their experiences. Dr. Geetha used real-life examples to highlight the importance of awareness and legal provisions in both professional and educational settings.

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10. Street Play on Senior Citizen Rights on 19th November 2025 in Koodal Village, Shankarpally Mandal, Kanga Reddy District, Telangana

The Legal Aid Society of (LAW) Law, Hyderabad, (P&C), Hyderabad, conducted a Street Play in Koodal village, Shankarpally Mandal, Kanga Reddy District, Telangana, focusing on the rights and welfare of senior citizens on 19th November 2025 from 1:00 pm to 3:30 pm. The program aimed to educate villagers and officials, who were informed about the legal assistance available to the day before. This initiative aimed to educate seniors about their legal rights.

Dr. V. V. Rao Kumar, Assistant Professor at (LAW) Law, Hyderabad, delivered a speech emphasizing the importance of a supportive social structure with legal provisions to help protect their rights. He also elaborated on the legal safeguards available to ensure the well-being of the elderly. He highlighted several government schemes, including the Rashtriya Vayoshiksha Yojana, which has benefited over 700,000 senior citizens by providing safe and sensitive services. Additionally, he informed seniors about health insurance coverage of 25 lakh rupees for every senior citizen aged 75 years and older.

The program focused on senior provisions by Mr. Jadhav and Mr. Arjun about the rights of senior citizens in India, as outlined in the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007. The law mandates that children and relatives provide maintenance for their elderly family members. Senior citizens have rights related to the protection of their life and property, access to medical facilities, and benefit from government welfare schemes, including pensions and social assistance (although some assistance are currently suspended), as well as higher interest rates on savings.

Further information was shared about Elderline, a toll-free number (1456) dedicated to the safety and welfare of senior citizens. This service addresses concerns related to pensions, legal matters, medical assistance, care of those, essential supplies, and care for those in need of seniors. The presentation concluded with a powerful message: "Respecting seniors is not just our duty, but our right."

The street play performed by the law students portrayed the story of elderly parents who disowned all their property to their son, placing their complete trust in him. Once he passed away, the son locked them out of the house, leaving them in economic poverty. A lawyer intervened, first advising the disowned parents to approach the court, which ultimately ruled in their favor. The ruling stated that even if property is disowned to a child, parents retain the legal right to claim it if the child fails to provide care. This story underscores the legal provisions available to parents against neglect and abandonment.

The availability of free legal aid for women at the Legal Services Authority office was also highlighted. The elderly women expressed their gratitude to the ICFAI Law School and the Legal Aid Society members for their efforts in spreading legal awareness and were pleased to learn about their region. Ms. Sri Kishor delivered the vote of thanks, expressing appreciation for the elderly members who attended the program and the facilities provided by the gram panchayat to host the event in Kandakal village. The event was funded by the JHLL management to promote legal awareness in Telangana, under the guidance of Prof. Ramakrishna, Director and Prof. V. Prasad Reddy, Dean of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad. - * Redressal Mechanisms: The step-by-step legal procedure for filing a complaint and the inquiry process.
- * Employee Rights & Responsibilities: Emphasizing that a safe workplace is a collective responsibility.

Interactive Q&A

The session concluded with a vibrant Question and Answer (Q&A) segment. Employees from Blue Cloud Software actively participated, raising queries regarding procedural complexities, the need for confidentiality, and the protection of confidentiality. The speakers provided clear, legally backed responses, resolving uncertainties and empowering attendees with essential knowledge.

12. Legal Defense on Women's Health and Hygiene by Dr. J. Kiranmayi on 26th
December 2022

The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, IITM, Hyderabad, presented a legal petition around the legal protections under the Sexual Harassment of Women at the Workplace Act and related Conventions and Statutes. The speaker featured Dr. Kiranmayi, a senior lecturer of the PGDIP Law and Crime level of CEI, led a petition discussing the legal protections under the Sexual Harassment of Women at the Workplace Act and related Conventions and Statutes. The concerns for several menstrual equity, proposed menstrual leave policy, and the need for accessible hygiene products, highlighting the importance of creating school toilets around menstruation.

Key topics included the mental health aspects of period equity, the necessity of proper WASH facilities in educational institutions, and the challenge of implementing paid menstrual leave in developing countries like India. The discussion also addressed concerns related to PDSH and the importance of taking medical attention.

The petition emphasized that menstrual health is closely tied to broader issues of human rights and gender equality, highlighting the need to create both men and women's safe menstruation. Empowering education can help challenge such taboos, though progress may take time.

In conclusion, addressing menstrual health and its accompanying stigma is vital for women, and involving men in these discussions is essential for eliminating menstrual equity issues. The Legal Petition, created & coordinated by Dr. J. Kiranmayi and presented by the Legal Aid Member of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, with the aim of raising awareness about women's health and as they through the petition.

The Legal Aid Lawyer of ICFAI Law School, UTMU, Hyderabad, presented a legal podcast focused on gender-based violence and workplace harassment, emphasizing the POAH Act of 2021 and addressing student concerns. The episode features Gen. Subalaxmi Devathi Devi, President of the Women's Federation in Telangana and a crisis family law advocate. She discussed the varying forms of abuse in various educational institutions and workplaces. Gen. Devathi Devi highlighted the concept of non-physical violence, which includes emotional, psychological, financial, and digital abuse, and highlighted their long-term impact. The discussion covered the framework of the POAH Act, the role of Internal Commissions, due process, and the challenges of implementation, particularly concerning compliance made by non and LGBTQ+ individuals. Special mention was given to students, interns, and trainees, addressing the reporting barriers they face, such as stigma and poor process. The episode concluded with guidance on recognizing early warning signs of abuse and the responsibilities of institutions. The Legal Podcast recording is coordinated by Dr. S. Sarwan and recorded by the Legal Aid Lawyer of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, with the aim of raising awareness about gender-based violence and workplace harassment.



14. Report of the Legal Panel on Pregnancy-related violence by Legal Aid Members on 4th January 2016

The Legal Aid Society of (ICFAL Law School), (ICLL), Hyderabad, has produced an insightful legal opinion that draws out the central issue of pregnancy-related violence. This opinion forms defined members of the Legal Aid Society, who bring their expertise and perspective to the discussion.

The opinion offers a thorough exploration of pregnancy-related violence, paying particular attention to the complex interplay of autonomy and consent. It begins with a historical overview of autonomy in India, tracing the evolution of citizens' legislations about promoting self and more ethical practices in this field. The discussion highlights key milestones in the legislative landscape, including the recent ban on commercial surrogacy, and examines the far-reaching implications of the ban on personal autonomy, medical practice, and the broader society.

In the latter half of the opinion, the participants delve into an in-depth analysis of the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act of 1971. The participants provide a comprehensive review of the Act, detailing the legislative intent for termination of pregnancy and evaluating its impact on women's autonomy and rights. The analysis emphasizes how the legislation has shaped women's access to reproductive health services and the ongoing struggle for reproductive justice in India.

Likewise, we expect a robust dialogue that not only addresses the legal dimensions of these related issues but also engages with the ethical considerations and practical implications for women facing pregnancy-related violence.



32. Speed Mentoring Program on the role of National, State, and District Women's Commissions in enhancing women's safety and welfare, held at Charvat Village, Khandi Mandal, Sangareddy District, on January 18, 2023.

The Legal Aid Society of KJ Somaiya Law School, WSK, Hyderabad, organized a speed mentoring program on the role of National, State, and District Commissions in women's safety and welfare for women aspirants, ward members, and AISA members. The event took place on January 18, 2023, at the Charvat Green Parkhouse meeting hall, Khandi Mandal, Sangareddy District.

Attendees included Sen. Charvat Rishi, Deputy of Charvat Village and Training President of the Telangana State Women's Empowerment Federation, as well as Sen. Ashli Sangritha, Deputy of Charvat Village, along with other aspirants from Yashwanthpuram, Chirigatam, and Bhanu. The ward members and AISA members also participated in the legal awareness program.

The program featured a speech that raised awareness about the National Commission for Women (NCW) and described its efforts to address violations against women and provide their rights. The speech also highlighted digital tools, such as the *Red Legal Guide* app and *Red-Box*, which provide legal resources and advice to women. It concluded by encouraging women to understand their rights, emphasizing that "no woman is the first on the list of victims." The NCW helpline number for women's safety is 14988.

Additionally, a panel discussion by legal aid members provided an overview of the functioning of State and District Women Commissions, which are necessary bodies established to protect women's rights and address issues such as violence, discrimination, and harassment. These commissions handle complaints, offer counseling and legal support, and collaborate with law enforcement and institutions in their own regions. They monitor the implementation of constitutional laws and welfare schemes, advise governments, and promote awareness to ensure gender equality and justice. The women's protection cell number is 027262199, and the helpline number is 040-1783333.

A case presentation by legal aid members illustrated how victims deal with real-life problems, specifically focusing on a domestic violence case. The example involved a woman who approached the office to file a complaint about abuse from her husband and in-laws. The commission assisted her by referring her to a protection officer assigned under the Domestic Violence Act, ensuring her safety through counseling and protection orders. The case presentation also discussed the ways women can approach the commission when facing economic obstacles and highlighted the commission's role in providing support. Feedback from attendees confirmed that they gained a clear understanding of the women's commission's functioning and its various activities aimed at protecting and promoting the welfare of women. The event was funded by WSK Management to promote legal literacy in the state of Telangana. Under the guidance of Prof. Karthik Babu, Director, and Prof. Pragy Kotha, Dean KJ Somaiya Law School, Hyderabad.

The discussion encompassed key legislative provisions, including the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Section

(NCFE), and the University Institute Advancing (UIA), specifically related to issues surrounding sexual assault and drug.

A particularly engaging highlight of the event was a drama performed by Legal Aid students, which effectively illustrated key aspects of the Domestic Violence Act. This performance not only informed the disadvantaged students on the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2001, it simplified complex legal language, demonstrating the steps for registering complaints and obtaining protective orders, and emphasized strategies for effectively managing domestic violence cases.

Throughout the event, the Women Inquest actively engaged with the audience, raising insightful questions and expressing their appreciation for the insights led by the students of ICPAL Law School. Their curiosity indicated a strong interest in applying the knowledge gained to foster a safer community. The event was particularly commendable by Dr. S. Kannan, the President of the Legal Aid Society, alongside dedicated members of the ICPAL Law School's Legal Aid team in Hyderabad, demonstrating a collaborative effort to promote legal awareness and support for women's rights.

The Law School program focused on women's safety and protection that women PFI members and Julia Weidman resulted in several positive outcomes:

1. **Awareness and Educating Women:** Many participants gained valuable insights into their rights, legal provisions, and available support systems to protect themselves against violence and harassment.

2. **Community Engagement:** The program fostered strong community engagement, encouraging discussions about gender issues and the importance of women's safety in local areas.

3. **Action Plans:** Participants offered suggestions that led to the development of action plans addressing safety concerns, including improved community watch initiatives and increased collaboration with local law enforcement.

4. **Government Support:** There was an increased recognition of the need for government support in providing resources and funding for women's safety initiatives.

5. **Empowerment of Women PFI Members:** The program empowered women in leadership roles, enhancing their confidence and commitment to advocating for other women in their communities.

6. **Networking Opportunities:** Women PFI members had the chance to network with local NGOs and government officials, opening pathways for further engagement and support.

Overall, the Law School program significantly contributed to enhancing women's safety awareness and mobilizing community efforts for protective measures.

The Law School program in Pimpri-Chinchwad identified several major issues related to women's safety and protection, including:

1. **Lack of Awareness:** Many women remained unaware of their rights, legal provisions, and the resources available to support them in cases of violence or harassment.

2. **Ineffective Support Mechanisms:** There were gaps in the existing support systems, including inadequate access to legal aid and counseling services for victims of violence.

3. **Domestic Violence:** Deeply ingrained societal norms and attitudes regarding gender roles contributed to situations of domestic violence, leading to the ongoing fear and oppression.

4. **Limited Engagement with Law Enforcement:** There was a perceived lack of responsiveness from local law enforcement agencies regarding women's safety concerns, which hindered effective collaboration.

5. **Resource Constraints:** The availability of funding and resources for women's safety initiatives was limited, affecting the implementation of effective action plans.

6. **Domestic Violence:** A significant number of cases of domestic violence were reported, highlighting the urgent need for targeted interventions to protect vulnerable women.

7. **Transportation Safety:** Transportation challenges, such as unsafe public transport options, increased risks for women commuting alone, particularly after dark.

8. **Cultural Barriers:** Cultural stigmas surrounding women's empowerment and safety often discouraged women from reporting incidents of violence or seeking help.

Addressing these issues is essential for improving the overall safety and protection of women in the region, as highlighted by the program's findings.

The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, IFHE, Hyderabad, organized a guest lecture on the theme "Access to Justice: Impact and Challenges" on February 7, 2024. The lecture was delivered by the Hon'ble Sri Justice P. Sam Koshy, Judge at the High Court for the State of Telangana and Executive Chairman of the Telangana State Legal Services Authority.

The welcome address was given by Prof. Arunaj Rishi, Dean of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, who emphasized on access to justice as a fundamental right and the purpose of the lecture. Prof. Ravishankaraji, Director of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, delivered introductory remarks, highlighting the activities, achievements and contributions of the free legal aid clinic at the institution.

During his lecture, Hon'ble Sri Justice P Sam Koshy stressed that access to justice is the most essential feature of our Constitution. While we celebrate the rule of law as the cornerstone of a civilized society, we must examine whether justice is truly accessible to all or simply a luxury for a select few. Access to justice is not just about being able to approach a court or having legal representation; it is a fundamental human right and must reach the person in the most remote areas of the nation. Access to justice has become an integral component of right to life and personal liberty and the right to equality. It is also a key element of sustainable development, as recognized by the UN Sustainable Development Goal 16. Furthermore, it serves as the ultimate measure of a nation's commitment

to its citizens. It casts a constitutional responsibility on the law makers and the judicial system to ensure for each citizen equal opportunity of law.

When access to justice is facilitated, it can be transformative. It serves as a bridge between the rights on paper and the rights being realized in practice. It empowers the disadvantaged to become right-holders, enabling them to advocate for their fundamental rights. It fosters trust in the state, without the trust, individuals may resort to self-help, potentially leading to chaos. Mechanisms such as Public Interest Litigation (PIL) allow the judiciary to address systemic injustices affecting millions, including issues like bonded labor, environmental degradation, and the plight of industrial prisoners. An equitable and accessible legal system creates an environment conducive to business while protecting the assets of the poor, which is essential for economic stability.

Despite the potential for justice, many still find it to be an elusive dream due to deep-rooted challenges. Many people remain unaware of their constitutional rights, which makes them vulnerable to exploitation. Nevertheless, access to justice is not limited to having legal awareness. The justice system must be accessible enough for everyone. Physical accessibility of courts is one such aspect. We are convinced that we are progressing as we witness persons representing themselves and lawyers appearing virtually for their clients.

To bridge these gaps, we must adopt a people-centered approach rather than merely emphasizing court-based access. Possible actions include promoting alternative dispute resolution mechanisms including Lok Adalats, mediation, and conciliation as speedy and affordable alternatives to traditional litigation, actively educating communities about their rights, and utilizing e-courts, virtual hearings, and digital filing to eliminate geographical barriers and expedite legal processes. The legal community should view legal aid as a professional duty rather than a charitable effort. The law fraternity must act as the backbone of the constitutional promise. The institutions imparting legal education must play a proactive role in this. For law students, it should mean futuristic exposure of legal aid and access to justice. It is the collective responsibility of judges, lawyers, policymakers, and civil society to dismantle the obstacles posed by poverty, ignorance, and complexity.

Additionally, the Hon'ble Justice presented prizes to the winners of the inter legal aid competition held for the students of KJ Somaiya Law School (IHL). This event is funded by the IHL management to enhance legal skills among the BBA LLB (Hons.), BA LLB (Hons.), and BA LLB (Hons.) students of KJ Somaiya Law School, Hyderabad. The programme concluded with the inauguration by the faculty coordinator of Legal Aid Society Dr. T. Kannan, followed by the National Anthem.

The Legal Aid Society of ICFAL Law School, Hyderabad, organized a speed mentoring program focused on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012, at SMP Universal School, Maharegpet Village, Hanamkonda District, Rangareddy District, Telangana, on 24th February, 2023, approximately 200 students, along with the Chairman, Principal, and teachers, participated in the event.

Prof. V. Devisi Sanku, Dean of ICFAL Law School, Hyderabad, explained the significance of the Act, emphasizing the importance of raising awareness and reporting potential incidents among students and teachers. He discussed various ways to prevent and recognize child sexual abuse. The discussion paid special attention to confidently reporting to and reporting such situations and underscored the role of parents and adults in ensuring a culture of safety, trust, and respect for every child.

Legal aid students presented a poster outlining the process for reporting sexual abuse to parents, the police, and the school disciplinary committee. Additionally, students performed a skit act to raise awareness about child abuse, demonstrating ways for children to protect themselves. They shared crucial information, including the child helpline number (1025), the police helpline number (112), and the POCSO Helpline facility provided by the National

Commission for Protection of Child Rights. An interactive game made the session about law and ethics regarding DDCSO. Law teachers were engaging for the students.

Feedback from attendees indicated that they gained a clear understanding of the DDCSO Act and its various provisions. The Act emphasizes that students should not remain silent if they experience sexual abuse; they should report such incidents immediately to their parents, the police, or school authorities. This event was hosted by the P&R Management & Practice Legal Center in Tulangagung under the guidance of Prof. F. Saifulhuda Saif, Director of KCF Law School, Hyderabad. The Legal Aid Society of ICFAL Law School, IFHE, Hyderabad, organized a street play in their premises about free legal aid through Lok Adalat in Nandigama Village, Patancheru Mandal, Sangareddy District, Telangana. This event was held in connection with the upcoming Lok Adalat scheduled for March 26, 2024, as of 10:00 am in Telangana, organized by the Telangana State Legal Services Authority. The aim of the program is to educate people about their legal rights, available free legal services, and the resolution of pending disputes through Lok Adalat (People's Court). Approximately 80 members, including members of the local committee, and neighborhood residents eligible for free legal aid, participated in the program.

Lok Adalat offers a speedy and amicable justice mechanism for legal disputes. It helps individuals such as women, children, minorities and ICFAL beneficiaries, and those with low-income, who are pending court cases or pre-litigation matters without incurring any fees. During the event, members of the legal aid team presented posters highlighting the features of Lok Adalat, which offers dispute resolution in a timely and cost-effective manner, eliminating the need for lengthy court proceedings. This system encourages cooperation between parties, saving both time and money, while also reducing the burden on the courts and creating a peaceful society.

The students made 10 Lok Adalat sets that had a display, primarily focusing on civil and minor disputes, that promoting justice under the aegis of the court. The street play illustrated various aspects of Lok Adalat, including the legal aid to a disadvantaged right to equal to Article 19(1), and emphasized that there are no fees involved along with quick disposal of cases.

The Legal Aid Society of ICFAL Law School, IPHE, Hyderabad, organized a legal awareness program focusing on the right against exploitation. This event was held in collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) of Medak District under the Chair Mani Chakraborty, as NGO dedicated to women's welfare and the well-being of girl children. The program took place on Monday, April 27, 2020, at Jhansi Lingapur village, located in Ranayampet Mandal, Medak District.

Speakers included Mr. S. Eswarajee, the Chief Legal Aid Officer Counsel from the DLSA, and Mr. Ramakrishna, the Sarpanch of Jhansi Lingapur Village. The primary goal of these programs is to educate rural communities about their rights against forced labor, human trafficking, and child labor.

During the event, the Chief Legal Aid Counsel delivered a speech that highlighted several key areas, including the violation of Trafficking (as outlined in Article 23 of the Constitution); the prohibition of victims from being sold for any purpose; and the right of women to seek redress. He emphasized the importance of raising awareness regarding minimum wage, right to social security benefits for farming and other wage workers. Additionally, he provided information on the free legal aid services available under DLSA offices in Medak and stressed the importance of the National Helpline number 1025 for legal advice and assistance.

A game exhibition titled "Rights in Decision from Government" was successfully organized. This exhibition aimed to take awareness about forced labor and the sexual harassment of women. The program, which was held on Article 23 of the Constitution of India, the Sexual Harassment (Prevention) Act of 1976, and the POCSO Act of 2012, presented the rights of individuals in an accessible manner. The event received a positive response, a testament of the law is true power.

Innovative game scenarios conceived by legal aid members secured participants' understanding of child labor, its sexual exploitation of women, and the abolition of bonded labor. The attendees expressed their appreciation for the efforts of the Legal Aid Society in expanding their awareness about an inhuman right. The pamphlet that details the legal aspects of exploitation was instrumental in the participants in the Telugu language. This remains aimed to enhance understanding and awareness of the rights and protections available to the community.

The event was hosted by the ICLM management under the guidance of Prof. Kavayana Daga, Director, and Prof. Y. Prasad Reddy, Dean of ICLM Law School, Hyderabad to promote legal awareness in Telangana.
