Report of Legal Aid Camp and Street Play/Jan Sunwahi Program held on 5th October 2024 in Shankarpally.

The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad, in collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority of Ranga Reddy District and ANKITA NGO, successfully hosted an event to promote and issue e-Shram cards for unorganized workers. This initiative aimed to raise awareness about the e-Shram scheme and facilitate the registration of workers for essential social security benefits, including accidental insurance coverage of Rs 2 lakh under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana. The event kicked off with an engaging street play by Legal Aid members, highlighting the significance of the e-Shram scheme, the importance of insurance, and how these benefits can secure their futures.

The Jan Sunwahi featured notable attendees including Smt. P. Sridevi, Senior Civil Judge and Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority, Prof. Y.
