Street Play (Nukkad Natak)
on Free Legal Aid Through Lok Adalat

Nandigama Village, Patancheru Mandal, Sangareddy District, Telangana

The Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, IFHE, Hyderabad, organized a street play to raise awareness about free legal aid through Lok Adalat in Nandigama Village, Patancheru Mandal, Sangareddy District, Telangana. This event was held in connection with the upcoming Lok Adalat, scheduled for March 28, 2026, at all district courts in Telangana, organized by the Telangana State Legal Services Authority. The aim of the program is to educate people about their legal rights, available free legal services, and the resolution of pending disputes through Lok Adalat (People's Court). Approximately 60 attendees, including members of the rural communities, and marginalized sections eligible for free legal aid, participated in the program.

Lok Adalat offers a cost-free and amicable settlement mechanism for legal disputes. Eligible individuals—such as women, children, members of SC/ST communities, and those with low incomes—can resolve pending court cases or pre-litigation matters without incurring court fees. During the event, members of the legal aid team presented posters highlighting the features of Lok Adalat, which allows disputes to be settled in a friendly and straightforward manner, eliminating the need for

lengthy court proceedings. This system encourages compromise between parties, saving both time and money, while also reducing the burden on the courts and ensuring prompt justice.

The decisions made in Lok Adalat are final and binding, primarily focusing on civil and minor disputes, thus promoting peace within the community. The street play illustrated various aspects of Lok Adalat, including that legal aid is a fundamental right (as stated in Article 39A), and emphasized that there are no fees involved along with quick disposals of cases.

The street play effectively informed citizens about how to contact District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs) for assistance, empowering them to utilize pre-litigation services and legal aid clinics. The event was organized with financial support from the IFHE Management and under the direction of the Director and the Dean of ICFAI Law School, IFHE, Hyderabad. The event was coordinated by Dr. S. Kannan, the Faculty Coordinator of Legal Aid Society, along with legal aid members from ICFAI Law School, IFHE, Hyderabad.

Street Play Held in Nandigama to Promote Awareness on Lok Adalat Services

In an effort to spread awareness about free legal aid and the benefits of Lok Adalat, the Legal Aid Society of ICFAI Law School, IFHE, Hyderabad, organised a street play in Nandigama village of Patancheru Mandal. The programme was conducted ahead of the Lok Adalat scheduled to be held on March 28, 2026, across all district courts in Telangana under the supervision of the Telangana State Legal Services Authority. As part of the awareness drive, members of the Legal Aid Society also or-

ganised a poster presentation explaining the purpose, process and advantages of Lok Adalat to the local public. The organisers explained that Lok Adalat serves as a free and effective platform for the amicable settlement of disputes, allowing eligible individuals to resolve both pending court cases and pre-litigation matters without paying court fees. Women, children, SC/ST communities and economically weaker sections are among those who can benefit from this legal aid mechanism. The awareness programme highlighted how Lok Adalat helps parties settle disputes



through mutual understanding and compromise, thereby avoiding lengthy court procedures. It was noted that the system not only saves time and expenses for litigants but also helps reduce the burden on courts while ensuring speedy



justice. During the street play, the students demonstrated how various cases can be resolved through Lok Adalat, including compoundable criminal matters, cheque bounce cases, bank recovery disputes, motor accident claims, land acqui-

sition issues and other civil matters, excluding divorce-related cases. The organisers also informed villagers that the awards passed in Lok Adalat are final and binding, making it an important forum for quick and peaceful resolution of dis-

putes. The event was organised with financial support from the IFHE Management as part of the institution's initiative to strengthen legal awareness and improve access to justice at the grassroots level.
