The Synergy of Speech, NLP, and Generative AI

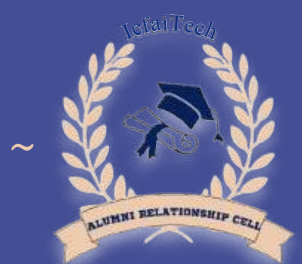

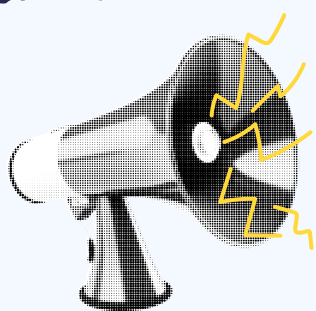


CLIMATE CHANGE AWARENESS

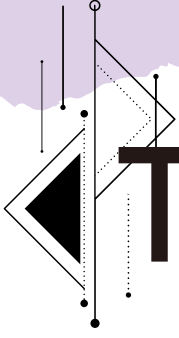
Nukkad Natak

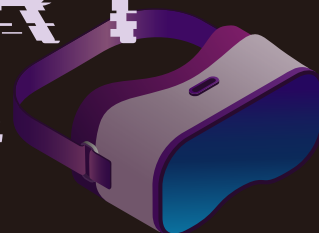

XR JUMPSTART WORKSHOP

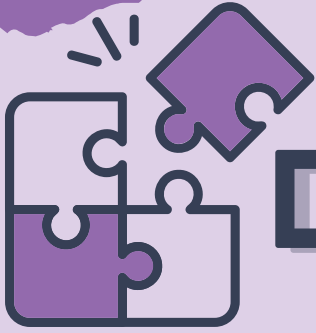


From October 28–30, 2024, the Department of CSE organized the XR Jumpstart Workshop, giving students a hands-on introduction to Extended Reality (XR) technologies such as Virtual Reality (VR) and Augmented Reality (AR). Through interactive lectures, demos, and practical sessions, participants gained valuable exposure and even developed their own VR games.



Despite challenges in managing technical setups and crowd logistics, the event witnessed 300+ registrations, and over 400 students participated actively. The workshop proved to be a transformative learning experience, fostering creativity, collaboration, and deeper understanding of XR, while opening pathways for future internships and innovations in immersive technologies.





DECIPHER

For lessons of living, we constantly learn.

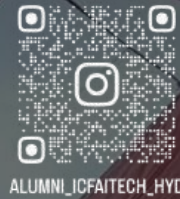
