

9th Doctoral Thesis Conference, April 21-22, 2016

The two-day Ninth Annual Doctoral Thesis Conference was organized by IBS Hyderabad, during April 21-22, 2016. This edition of the Conference has been organized in collaboration with the Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research (IGIDR), Mumbai. Research scholars working in various fields related to Management studies and Economics are participating. The conference has received 235 research papers of which 161 have been accepted after review by an expert committee.

The inaugural session of the Conference on April 21, 2016, had Prof. S Mahendra Dev, Director and Vice-Chancellor, IGIDR, Mumbai, as Chief Guest. Prof. Dev, in his address to the young researchers, touched upon the importance of quality of data and explained the reasons for the reduction of GDP at current prices while it increased at constant prices, and the growing difference between the wholesale price index and the consumer price index. He also elaborated on the difference between the Index of Industrial Production and gross value added.

Prof. Dev spoke about how growth in the manufacturing sector did not always lead to employment growth and cited the example of countries like China, Indonesia and Thailand. He threw light upon the share of services in GDP and employment in India and said 'Make in India' should include services too. One of the ways of increasing GDP, he said, was by increasing the participation of women in the workforce.

Prof. Dev said though India was improving its ranking among countries in ease of doing business, much more had to be done. He also spoke on the issues of Bankruptcy and the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code 2015, which has been sent to the Lok Sabha. He said there was a need for a single consolidated code for insolvency resolution for all entities. On the issue of Corruption, Prof. Dev said it was becoming a research issue in developing economies, and that it was only when bankruptcy law and corruption were addressed that ease of doing business in the country would improve.

Prof. J. Mahender Reddy, Vice-Chancellor of IFHE, presided over the inaugural session. In his address, he introduced the University and the Chief Guest to the participants, who are from across the country. Addressing the scholars, he said professional interaction with the experts and their peer group during their presentation would help them improve the quality of their research. Urging the participants to focus on quality of data and sources, he told them to use their discretion and logic to select appropriate models. He announced that the 10thdoctoral thesis conference would be held in collaboration with IGIDR in April 2017. In the Valedictory session on April 22, Prof. Bhanoji Rao, Hon.Professor, IBS Hyderabad and former Professor at National University of Singapore delivered a talk on 'Aiming for Excellence in Research'.

One year future plan of entrepreneurial development cell of IFHE

To generate awareness among the present or erstwhile members of the IFHE community regarding entrepreneurship and to enthuse, assist and mentor people to start entrepreneurial ventures. For this purpose, the EDC will:

- 1. Conduct a primary study on the awareness level and attitude towards entrepreneurship among the IFHE students.
- 2. Appoint an eminent industry person as patron (nominal head) of the EDC: this will bring media attention
- 3. Visits to institutes who have start-up incubation cells, such as ISB, BITS Hyderabad to learn best practices related to start-ups & incubation.
- 4. Organize lectures, workshops and seminars by renowned personalities from different domains of expertise, competitions of various kinds etc. round-the-year in order to create awareness and to sharpen business acumen of students and aspiring entrepreneurs.

- 5. Constitute a panel of mentors (industry experts): The panel should include eminent industry people like GMR etc. or with the help of corporate relation, CMD, CRC of IFHE. Mentor students/others who have business ideas by bringing expertise to their doorstep. The EDC would be a networking hub for people aspiring to be entrepreneurs and also play a role in team building as a part of its mentorship. Mentoring the people at an early stage by giving proper direction and necessary exposure would be crucial in converting technical ideas/projects into viable business plans.
- 6. Arrange lectures by successful start-up persons: This will motivate the students to focus on start-up. And also arrange training for business plan preparation
- 7. Be an interface between the entrepreneurial activity in IFHE and the outside world, a consolidation of logistic and knowledge resources necessary to make a business plan and set up an enterprise.
- 8. Make an effort to increase and facilitate industry-academia interaction to promote new entrepreneurial ventures. An annual Start-up summit/ conclave may be conducted at IFHE to encourage exchange of ideas between industry and academia.
- 9. Form permanent associations with professional bodies and organizations, universities, corporations etc. to facilitate exchange of ideas and to promote entrepreneurial ventures. Knowledge partnerships will play an important role in engaging good expertise for the benefit of entrepreneurial activity at IFHE. Associations with venture capital firms and seed funds would be crucial in the setup of new ventures.
- 10. Organize IFHE Entrepreneurship week (Eweek), EDC's flagship event, as a culmination of its year-round activities.
- 11. Give permanent membership to all its student members, so that the benefit of mentorship and the EDC resources can be availed of even after graduating from the institute.
- 12. Promote entrepreneurship among alumni, invite alumni for interaction for the benefit of the present students and provide them all the resources available with the cell

27.20 Accreditations, Ratings & Rankings

AACSB

(Prof. V S P Rao will brief the meeting)

- Additional Inputs Required: The Initial Accreditation Committee (IAC) wanted additional information when the Initial Self Evaluation Report (iSER) was submitted during the first week of December 2015.
- IAC's Concerns: Basically IAC wanted the School to address three issues: (i) Improve the Faculty Qualification Criteria, (ii) Complete one cycle of Assurance of Learning and (iii) Offer a detailed, step by step analysis of the Gaps confronting the School and how the School proposes to bridge those gaps IAC also suggested that the School should send an invitation to the Mentor and take his constructive suggestions and useful comments into account before uploading the revised iSER before June 15, 2016.
- **Invitation to the Mentor:** Accordingly, the invitation was extended to the Mentor, Prof. Colm Kearney, Head of the Monash Business School and Dean of the Faculty of Business and Economics. He readily accepted the invitation and visited the Campus during April 7-9, 2016.
- **Mentor's Visit:** Prof. Colm Kearney had a series of meetings with the Vice Chancellor, the Director, faculty, students from all streams and support staff–apart from overseeing campus infrastructure through a conducted tour assisted by the Director, Administration.
- Mentor's Suggestions: Prof. Colm Kearney wanted the School to enhance the criteria for faculty qualifications immediately and suggested that the School should build several scenarios and choose the one that enhances the brand image. He also suggested that the School should not encourage faculty to contribute articles/cases to pay and publish journals. He advised the AACSB Team to complete the AOL processes quickly. The School should relentlessly try to bridge all the critical gaps in terms of faculty qualifications, sufficiency ratios and those falling in "Other" category etc., before May 2017 and be ready to send invitation to the Peer Review Team.
- Scenario Building: After the Mentor's visit, a series of meetings were held and several scenarios have been presented before taking an informed decision. Accordingly, a rigorous faculty qualification criterion has been chosen matching the School's brand image and reputation, duly approved by the Vice Chancellor and the Director. A decision not to encourage faculty to contribute articles/cases to pay and publish journals has also been taken and communicated to IAC.

- Assurance of Learning Processes: AOL processes, especially those relating to oral and written communication skills, have been initiated choosing a sample of two sections of MBA students immediately after they returned to campus in the first week of June. The AOL processes for all Ph.D students, in the interim, have already been completed. Another round of AOL on MBA students will be conducted before the end of June 2016 and the results will be analyzed before sending the report to the Mentor in the First/Second week of July 2016. 

Oct 22-23, 2016	The present age of globalization and liberalization in trade, rapid societal and technological changes in 21st century have led to new trends in consumer habits, tastes and preferences and also poses new challenges for consumer protection. The main objective of the traders is to earn maximum profits neglecting the interests of the consumers and indulging into various activities such as selling of poor quality and adulterated goods, under weighing and in some cases overcharging. They are also misleading the consumers with false advertisements and befool by unscrupulous trade practices by market forces. The need of the hour necessitated to bring awareness in the consumers towards their rights and obligations. The government of India's 'jagograhakjago' campaign through media is to empower consumers in resolving identified challenges regarding product, service and food safety, is not sufficient to overcome major issues and challenges associated with the digital revolution, sustainable consumption and social exclusion. It is universally accepted that the extent of consumer protection is the true indicator of the level of progress of a Nation. To mark the significance of the consumer as 'consumer is king', World's Consumer Rights day is celebrated on 15th March and National Consumers Rights day on 24th December every year. To effectively protect a consumer buying goods or services through e-commerce would need a separate law, as other

countries have, such as UK Consumers Rights Act, 2015. It is felt that the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 in India is not sufficient to meet new challenges and issues in digital era and there is a need to bring changes to protect online consumers. In E-commerce, numerous problems arise due to the buyer and seller being at a distance. The various issues regarding defective goods as buyer does not have an opportunity to inspect or sample the goods or services, problems of fraudulence in card payments, lack of trust in regard to the safety of personal data discourage consumers from taking part in e-commerce and accepting new online services.
Consumer is the focal point and real deciding factor for all economic activities. The Consumer Affairs ministry has proposed many changes to the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 to protect consumer rights and simplify the judicial process to ensure swift and inexpensive justice by a new bill called Consumer Protection Bill 2015 keeping in view e-commerce boom and misleading advertisements posing new challenges. The Bill proposed to create separate adjudicatory authorities to decide consumer disputes which results in parallel jurisdiction to the authorities already in existence under the Act of 1986.The Bill also has not addressed the dichotomy with reference to VAT between online and physical purchase and it's impact on the consumer. The question of the non-alignment of VAT rates for similar goods and services when supplied online or offline and the subsequent question of the visible price differences to the consumers has therefore not addressed. The consumer need minimum skills and literacy to face new complex products and services, especially in the financial, medical and insurance sectors. Consumers have new requirements, e.g. demand for green products, which imply a need for special information.
In addition to this, complex and not comparable pre-contractual information prevents consumers to act as empowered consumers. The seminar will focus on the issue whether the existing legal framework is adequate to protect the interests of the consumer in contemporary India and what changes are required to the existing laws to accord protection to the online and offline consumers. Case studies of ICFAI going global

Richard McCracken, director, The Case Centre, U.K., the largest repository of management case studies in the world, appreciated the case study team of the ICFAI Business School and said that they will be seen as ambassadors of the case study method in India. He was speaking at a function organised at IBS to present awards to case authors who won the annual Case Centre Awards and Competitions-2016.

Mr. McCracken gave a presentation on the topic 'from local to global: the impact of the case method'. He praised the practice of case-based learning at IBS, and said that the cases developed by IBS were used in some of the best business schools and corporate organisations in the world. He particularly commended the development of culturally diverse cases at IBS, saying that in a globalised world, cultural knowledge and understanding are highly sought after.

Speaking about the worldwide impact of case studies from IBS, Mr. McCracken said 6,000 cases from IBS that were part of The Case Centre repository accounted for 10 per cent of the case collection, 7.5 per cent of the global sales, and 7 per cent of best sellers. In 2015, the cases from IBS were used by 870 business schools in 75 countries. The case studies from IBS have won eight Case Centre Awards since 2011, a press release said.

Dr. J. Mahender Reddy, Vice-Chancellor, ICFAI University, traced the institute's association with the Case Centre and how it had provided a platform to reach out to a global audience. Mr. McCracken presented the award in the 'ethics and social responsibility' category to Prof. G.V. Mural idhara and Namratha V. Prasad, authors of the case 'IKEA in Russia: ethical dilemmas'. Another award was given to Prof. Debapratim Purkayastha and Tangirala Vijay Kumar for their case 'Netflix: leveraging big data to predict entertainment hits', which won the Case Centre award in the 'knowledge, information, and communication systems management' category.

PPP called for providing affordable heathcare

PRINCIPAL Secretary (Health) Rajesh Tiwari has called for public-private partnership to provide affordable healthcare to the people.

Speaking at a one-day national seminar on Healthcare Management (NASHCAM) organised by ICFAI University on its campus here on Friday, Tiwari said this year state's healthcare budget has increased by ₹1,000 crore. The government has allocated ₹5,967 crore for healthcare sector this year. The seminar was aimed at creating awareness of the new age health economy and transition of healthcare to be patientcentric.

Principal secretary Rajesh Tiwari, health secretary Y Subramanyam, CEO of Apollo Hospitals KVS Prasad, Sanzyme CEO and Prof VN Rajasekharan Pilfai, ex-UGC chairman and retd. IGNOU vice-chancellor also spoke.

Pillai predicted the healthcare industry to grow to \$280 billion (₹18 lakh crore) by 2020 in India. Eight modular and three certificate programs in healthcare management would be launched by the ICFAI university.

IBS wins international case writing competition

ase authors of ICFAI Business School (IBS)-Hyderabad have won three prizes in the prestigious oikos Case Writing Competition, 2016, held by Switzerland-based oikos International.

A total of five cases, including two runnersup, were finalists in the competition. This annual event aims at promoting development of high quality case studies in the areas of sustainability, social entrepreneurship and sustainable finance. The competition receives case studies from across the world.

The case 'KTDAL: building sustainability through inclusion' by D. Satish and Nagendra Kumar MV. won the third prize in the corporate sustainability track. The case is about how the small-scale tea farmers in Kenya, after becoming the shareholders of Kenya Tea Development Agency Ltd., were able to adapt and implement sustainable business practices across the value chain.

In the social entrepreneurship track, the case on Sanergy, an entrepreneurial venture by the students of MIT that aims at providing sustainable sanitation in the urban slums of Kenya won the third prize.

Indu Perepu and Geeta Singh authored the case.

In the same track, the case titled 'Dr. Devi Shetty of Narayana Hrudayalaya: delivering quality cardiac care to the masses' authored by Prof. G.V. Muralidhara was the runner-up. The case is about Dr. Devi Shetty, and his plans to take Narayana Hrudayalaya public and whether he can sustain affordable healthcare after doing so.

In the sustainable finance track, the prizewinning case study was on a dilemma faced by The International Finance Corporation, on whether it should release its next round of funding worth US \$15 million to Corporación Dinant, a Hondurus-based palm oil and food company accused of human rights violations. The case was authored by D. Satish and Manish Agarwal.

He also encouraged the students to read law texts, journals and, moreover, case laws. To become good lawyers, he said, students should make every opportunity to


