



The fifth edition of the International Conference on Applied Economics received 95 papers from several international and Indian universities and research institutes of repute. Of these, 54 papers were presented. The technical sessions were arranged in various areas such as economic growth and development, industrial economics, international economics, financial and monetary economics, agriculture, health and the environment. In the inaugural address of the conference, Prof. K L Krishna, former Professor and Director, Delhi School of Economics and Chairperson, Madras Institute of Development Studies spoke on '*Credibility Revolution in Applied Econometrics*'. He traced the evolution of econometrics over the years and said that in India the progress of econometrics has been remarkable, and The Indian Econometrics in the country. Prof. Krishna said that in the last three decades there has been an improvement in the use of applied econometrics and called for encouraging

theoretical work in the area. The guest of honor, Prof. Bandi Kamaiah, Dean and Professor, School of Economics, University of Hyderabad and President, The Indian Econometric Society, said that with globalization, availability of high frequency data and high-speed computers, econometrics has progressed rapidly. In his welcome address, Dr. J Mahender Reddy, Vice-Chancellor of the University, highlighted the enormous contribution of Prof. Krishna to the field of econometrics. He mentioned that Prof. Krishna has guided many scholars, and has been a source of inspiration to students and scholars. He thanked TIES for collaborating with IBS for the conference.

Dr. Rangarajan, former Chairman, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, former Governor of Andhra Pradesh and former Governor of Reserve Bank of India and the Chancellor of ICFAI University delivered a special address. He said that, with the new directions that data processing is taking, the areas in which economics and econometrics are applied has been growing into diverse fields. He also said that statistics as a discipline is on the threshold of far reaching changes. Though big data has arrived, big insights are yet to arrive, Dr. Rangarajan stated. Indicating areas for economists to explore, he said the relationship between the real sector and the financial sector is an area that can be explored. Another area he suggested was the effect of real effective exchange rate on exports. '*Big Data's ascendency*' will bring about a shift in the way data is analyzed. Therefore economists and econometricians should study big data instead of leaving it to other specialists," he said.

The valedictory address was given by Dr. V. Subramanyam, Director, Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Telangana Government.

By the year 2018, we will be able to register revenue to the tune of Rs.75 lakh and subsequently Rs.1 crore by the year 2019-2020 and we will continue to extend our services to new clients (organizations).

- The Initial Self Evaluation Report (iSER) has been approved by the Initial Accreditation Committee (IAC) during the first week of August 2016—followed by a detailed note (known as 'decision letter') which has come from IAC on 9th September, 2016 outlining the action steps that need to be initiated immediately
- The decision letter, essentially, wants the School to (i) increase the number of qualified faculty in all categories; (ii) outline a detailed long term plan for developing faculty across all categories; (iii) indicate the progress made on the Assurance of Learning front, and (iv) submit an ISER update before June 16, 2017 after getting the document evaluated by the Mentor.
- Keeping the above requirements in the background, the AACSB Team has prepared the iSER Update throwing light on the following issues
 - Progress achieved by the School (June 01, 2015 May 31,2016)
 - Strategic initiatives enrollments, placements, alliances, revenues, curricula changes, research output etc
 - Intellectual capital scores and Assurance of Learning Cycle I Results
 - Summary report regarding how the concerns indicated by IAC are addressed
 - Key performance indicators of the School The AACSB team has created **20 performance indicators**—consisting of the following items that are going to be measured using data generated through a comprehensive questionnaire.

Key performance Indicators for measuring School's Progress

• Before January 10, 2017, the draft version of the ISER update will be sent to the Mentor for his comments. As things stand now, the School is able to address some of the major gaps which were reported previously—including

- Reduce the numbers in Other category from 74 to 20
- Bridge the gap in respect of career progression of students who have been placed previously
- Enhance ICs of faculty members—including cases, research articles, conference papers, book chapters etc.
- Conduct all three appraisals regarding teaching effectiveness of faculty
- There are, however, two major milestones to be crossed where certain glaring gaps still stare at us in the form of skewed distributions of ICs (especially where nearly 25 per cent faculty have very little publications to show) and cut down the numbers in 'Other' category
- To meet this problem the AACSB Team along with the Director have brainstormed at length and came forward with the following action plan:
 - Transfer Soft Skill trainers to a separate division—since they offer their services to other divisions of IFHE as well (after getting approval from the Mentor—who readily supported this initiative)
 - Look at the possibility of transferring faculty with zero ICs to other divisions of IFHE
 - Classify 5 members as IFHE faculty
 - Eliminate Adjunct faculty—especially in 'Other' category
 - Motivate faculty to improve their scores, especially those cases where the gap is not a big one in terms of ICs
 - Put healthy pressure on research scholars to complete their thesis (simultaneously releasing them from the teaching load)—already a good number of scholars have either submitted their thesis or on the verge of completing the dissertation work.
 - There are, however, three major gaps that need to be addressed and the School has enough time to cover the ground within the next couple of months—including (i) improving AOL cycle II results,--this exercise must begin immediately after submitting the ISER update for all students (ii) reducing skewed distribution in ICs, (iii) cutting down the numbers in Other category & improving faculty head count in SA, PA, IP & SP classifications (already the recruitment drive is on and that should improve the numbers in SA category within the next 2/3 months—apart from the School's own doctoral students completing the work.)
- In view of these healthy & encouraging developments, the AACSB Team feels that after reporting the above facts clearly (both the positive and negative sides of the coin) to the Mentor, a request should also be placed seeking the visit from the Peer Review Team at the earliest.

28.23 Revision of B.Tech Curriculum

Background

- Originally the B.Tech programme structure was adopted from BITS Pilani curriculum in the year 2002
- In the year 2011, curriculum was revised based on the requirement and needs of the time.
- After a gap of 5 years and looking at changing curriculum and structure at various National important technical Institutes like IITs, NITs and a few Deemed Universities, it is felt to look into the revision and restructuring of curriculum.
- The new curricula of IITs, NITs and along with ABET accredited Deemed Universities have been examined and studied before arriving at the new proposed curriculum for FST, IFHE.

- ✤ A 13 Member committee was constituted to look into the revision and restructuring needs of the new curriculum.
- A Proposed curriculum from the committee was put before Board of Studies(BoS) comprising of external members, Prof. M.S.Shunmugum, IIT Madras, Prof.K.Siva Kumar, IIT, Hyderabad, Prof. K Baskar, NIT Trichy, Prof. S Bapi Raju, IIT Hyderabad along with internal members.
- So BoS held extensive discussions and thoroughly revised the proposed curriculum
- ✤ All Changes suggested and agreed upon in BoS were incorporated in the new curriculum and approved by Academic Council.

The salient features of the New Curriculum are:

- ♦ Most contemporary and matching, pace with the needs of Industry
- Importance on System Engineering & Design
- * A number of New Theoretical Courses and Practicals have been introduced
- Strong Mathematical foundation
- Bench Marking with IITs & NITs and Deemed universities.
 - Introduced emerging areas witnessed in Industry like Data Analytics, Big Data, Smart grids that require a strong mathematical background.
 - Humanities and Social Sciences based courses finds increased weightage in Institutes core courses along with for first time a group of HS courses offered in open electives.
 - An optional slot provided for interested students to earn extra credits by doing a project, if they have the minimum credit requirements,
- Electives introduced from 3rd year onwards so that it would be advantageous for the students before they go for recruitment drive in the VII Semester
- Comprehensive viva voce along with personality development program introduced at the end of 3rd year in order to make the students industry ready in terms of both domain knowledge as well as holistic personality.
- The final semester provides for undertaking project either with Industry or in the university.



IBS student bags Rs. 47-lakh package

www.ith the highest package of Rs. 47.41 lakh, recruiters are thronging the ICFAI Business School (IBS), Hyderabad, as placement season has begun this month. The students from the class of 2016 also bagged eight international

placements. The highest domestic placement was Rs. 25 lakh per annum, while the average salary was Rs. 6.79 lakh. Around 96 per cent students have gone through placement assistance, said S. Venkata Seshiah, director, IBS.

He said over 200 recruiters participated in the process, of which 65 per cent are repeat recruiters who have been visiting the campus over the years.

Mr. Seshaiah said the BFSI (banking, financial services, and insurance) sector has contributed to 36 per cent of the total placements, while IT/ITES contribution was 30 per cent, followed by consulting, media and research, manufacturing, pharma and healthcare, e-commerce, and infra and telecom.

A few students opted out of placements for entrepreneurial pursuits.
