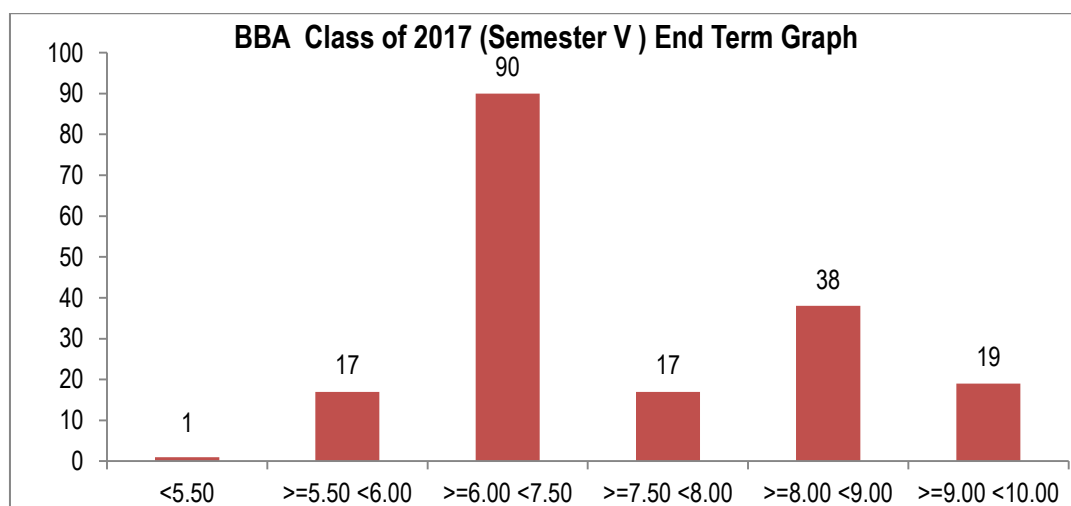

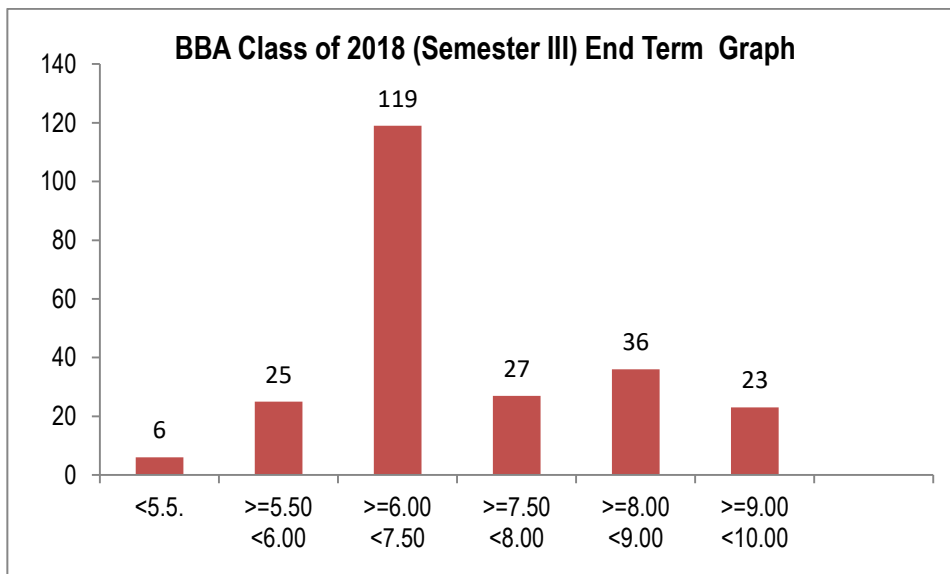

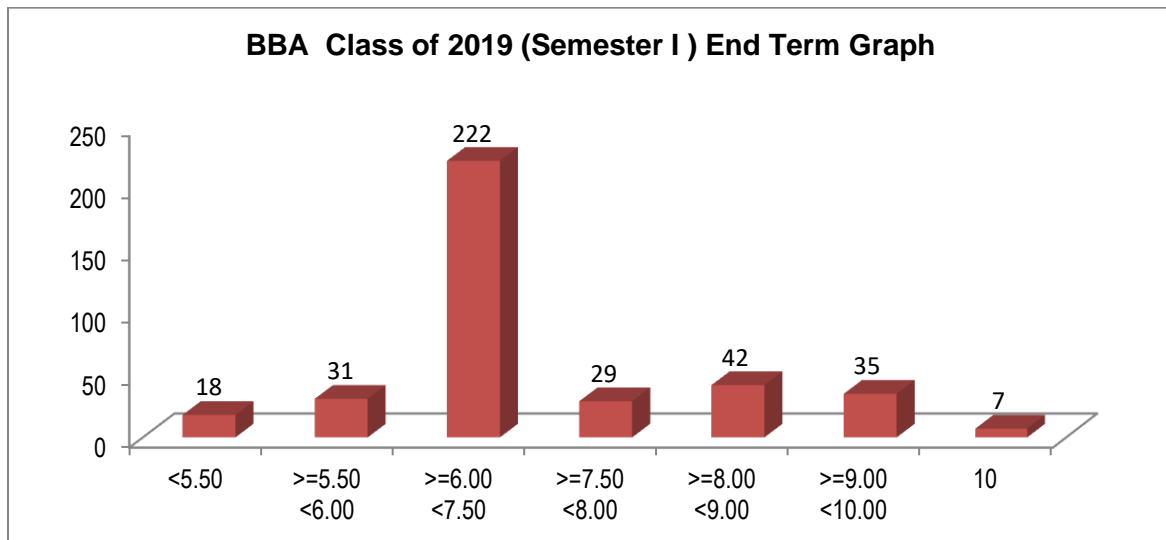

Panel Discussion on ‘Quality of the Doctoral Program in Economic and Business’

A Panel discussion on “Quality of the Doctoral Program in Economics and Business” was organized on April 20, 2017 at 11 AM -1 PM as part of The Centenary celebrations of the Indian Economic Association at IFHE Hyderabad.

Dr C. Rangarajan, Chancellor of IFHE University & former Governor, Reserve Bank of India and Conference President of the Centenary Year of the Indian Economic Association, chaired the panel discussion. The other Panel members are Prof K. L. Krishna, former professor & Director, Delhi School of Economics, Chairman, Madras Institute of Development Studies, Prof M.R. Rao, former Director IIM-B & former Dean, ISB, Hyderabad, and Prof S. Mahendra Dev, Director & Vice – Chancellor, IGIDR, Mumbai. Dr. Anil Kumar Thakur, General Secretary and Treasurer, the Indian Economic Association, welcomed the panelists and the audience.

At the discussion, Dr C Rangarajan opined that a teacher could not really be an effective teacher, if he/she is not involved in research and helping to create additional knowledge of the discipline. He resolutely said that the main role of the teacher is to ignite the minds of the young people. Prof K L Krishna pointed out that in very large number of universities in India, quality of supervision was not up to the mark. Quality was reasonably good only in about twenty institutes, like, IGIDR, Delhi School of Economics, Madras School of Economics,

Mumbai University, five first phase IITs. Prof M R Rao emphasized that social science research entails a delicate balance between rigor and relevance.

Prof Mahendra Dev mentioned that publications were one way of judging the quality of PhD program. Publishing in rigorous peer-reviewed journals was important. Prof J Mahender Reddy, Vice Chancellor , IFHE, narrating the phases of the PhD program at IBS Hyderabad, stressed on the importance of a rigorous coursework, qualifying examination, consisting of written and viva voce, Progress seminars, PhD Proposal Defense, Thesis data seminar and final thesis defense judged by a panel of examiners.

10th Doctoral Thesis Conference, April 20-21, 2017

The two-day Tenth Annual Doctoral Thesis Conference was organized by IBS Hyderabad, during April 20-21, 2017. This edition of the conference has been organized in collaboration with the Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research (IGIDR), Mumbai. Research scholars working in various fields related to Management studies and Economics participated. The conference has received 372 research papers of which 150 have been accepted after review by an expert committee.

The inaugural session of the Conference on April 20, 2017, had Prof. S Mahendra Dev, Director and Vice-Chancellor, IGIDR, Mumbai, as Chief Guest.

Professor Mahendra Dev delivered the keynote address on ‘Some Issues in Make in India’ during the inaugural function in the morning. He quoted data from the work done at IGIDR and pointed out that India should adopt service-cum-manufacturing approach as opposed to service-versus-manufacturing. He disagreed with the “export pessimism” prevalent in India by pointing out that exports did create jobs in the country. He pointed out that India should focus on the unexplored sectors like textiles, clothing, footwear and toys. He also stressed the need for greater integration of domestic industries with global production networks.

During his welcome address Dr. J. Mahender Reddy, Vice-chancellor of the University IFHE, thanked IGIDR for collaborating with IFHE in organizing the conference. He also expressed his gratitude to the Indian Economic Association for jointly organizing the panel discussion as part of the centenary year celebrations of the Association.

29.20 Accreditations, Ratings & Rankings

AACSB (Prof. V S P Rao will brief the meeting)

ISER (2010-2015)

The School has been able to cross many milestones as far as AACSB Accreditation is concerned. The ISER has been submitted on June 10, 2016. The Assurance of Learning testing processes have also been put in place and the results of the same have been appended to the ISER. The ISER got the stamp of approval from the Initial Accreditation Committee on September 9, 2016. The IAC mainly wanted the School to address the following issues

- Increase the coverage of qualified faculty across all disciplines
- Provide a detailed plan for the development of faculty
- Offer a detailed map regarding AOL Cycle I with a clear time line.

ISER Update (2011-16)

The School has tried to bridge all the gaps that were indicated by IAC in the first ISER Update which was submitted on 1st May, 2017, after seeking constructive inputs and valuable suggestions from the Mentor—restricting the narrative to 20 pages as instructed by IAC.

Progress achieved by the School so far

Mission critical activities: The School has tried its best to convert the rhetoric contained in the Mission statement into a concrete action plan and work on it successfully. To this end, faculty members have been asked to improve their IC in terms of high quality, peer-reviewed publications, cases, conference papers and also books. To improve awareness levels, the Mission and Vision statements have been put at prominent places. Both faculty and students have been educated about the importance of getting the global accreditation.

Faculty categories: Faculty members have been classified into four compartments, based on their IC scores, as mandated by AACSB. Those not meeting norms have been requested to improve their IC, within a clear timeline. To address the numbers in Other category series of interactive sessions were held with faculty members. Faculty members not meeting the norms have been given the option to relocate to other divisions of IFHE. As a result of all these steps taken by the Director, the numbers in Other category have come down from 77 to 24 (further reduced to 18 after transferring 6 faculty members to IFHE).

IC scores of Faculty: The IC scores of faculty have registered impressive growth during 2011-16 period, as captured in the following:

Student-faculty ratio: One of the concerns expressed by the Mentor was regarding the School's ability to handle increased workload with reduced faculty headcount. The School has successfully completed two rounds of recruitment and is able to hire new faculty meeting AACSB norms. Despite resignations happening at regular intervals, the School is able to bridge the talent gap admirably by sourcing talent from other cost-effective measures such as employee referral. As things stand now, the School is able to meet the UGC norms for the student-faculty ratio in respect of BBA and MBA programs—that is, BBA (1:30)& MBA (1:15).

Faculty Members in Other category: To reduce numbers in Other category, the School has decided to create a separate Soft Skill division, refrained from allocating work to Visiting faculty, adjunct faculty not meeting AACSB norms. The consultants and case center staff were also not given teaching assignments. Faculty members' not meeting AACSB norms have been relocated to other divisions of IFHE. All these measures have produced excellent results in that the headcount in 'Other' category has come down significantly from 77 to 24. After effecting transfers to other Divisions of IFHE, the headcount is going to come down to 18 with effect from 1st May 2017, which was coming in the way of the Accreditation process. This way, the School is able to address one of the major concerns expressed by the IAC.

The Assurance of Learning (AOL) Results: The AOL results of Cycle I were not very encouraging, barring the Ph.D. program. To address these critical issues, the School has decided to introduce course-embedded measures for BBA& MBA programs. The AOL Cycle II results of both BBA & Ph.D. programs show significant improvements, barring Conceptual Knowledge in respect of BBA program where the gaps are glaring enough to warrant remedial measures immediately. To put things on track, the School has made curricula changes,

introduced new cases, invented creative tools to improve teaching methods, and fine-tuned course-embedded measures so that in Cycle II major gaps do not surface. The School has been able to achieve this without any major problems so far. The MBA program's AOL results will be ready by September 1, 2017.

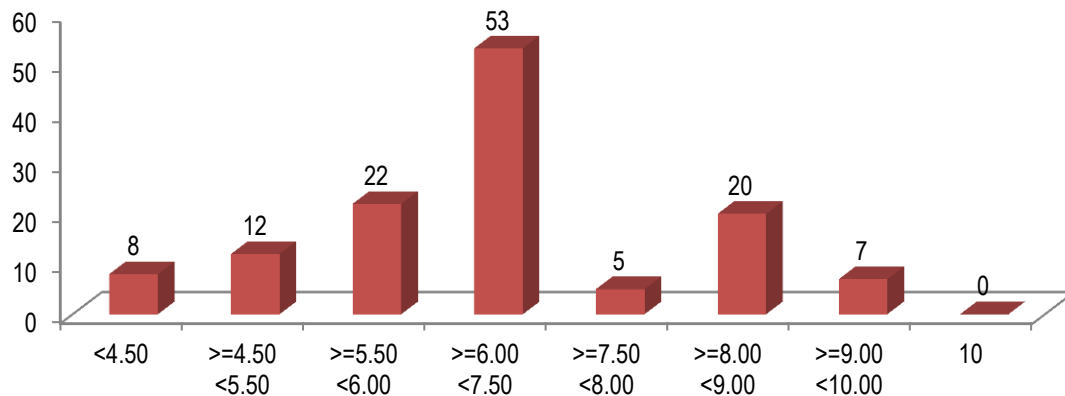

B.Tech Class of 2017 (Semester VII) End Term Graph

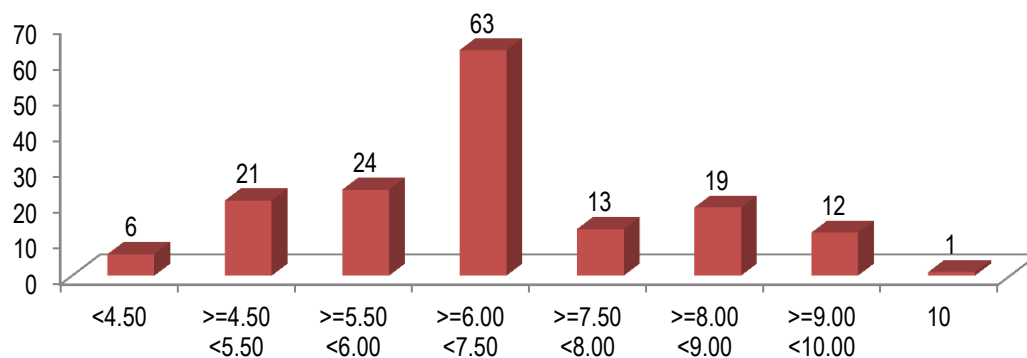

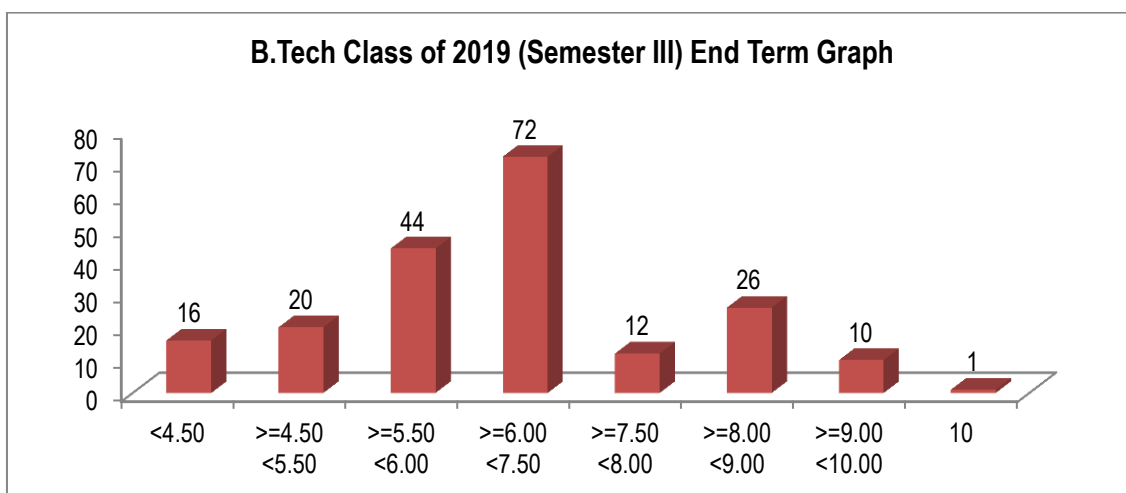
B.Tech Class of 2018 (Semester V) End term Graph

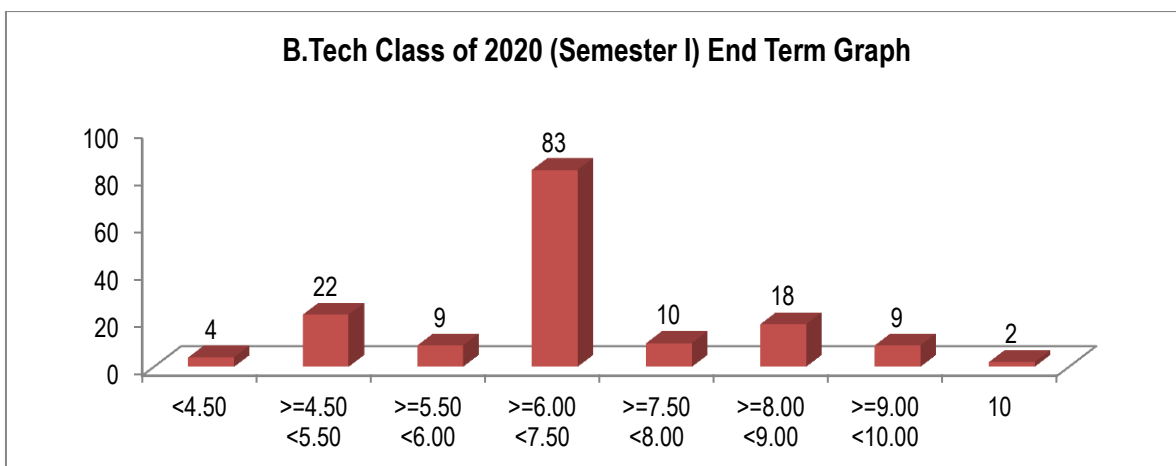

at the ITS Auditorium**

A meeting of the Parents of the B.Tech students and the Teachers of ITS(FST) was held on 07th January 2017 at 10:30A.M in the ITS auditorium. Director-ITS and Director Administration addressed the gathering.

The Director of ITS in his address welcomed the parents and stated that this kind of meeting with parents will be a regular event at ITS at the beginning of every semester. In his address, he has touched upon three important aspects of academic functioning at ITS, Academics, student discipline, and placement activity.

Following is the minutes of the Parents' Meet conducted at ITS on 7th January, 2017:

- The Director stressed upon how the university was particular about the students maintaining at least 75 percent attendance.
- Parents were urged to use the SIS to monitor the attendance and the academic progress of their wards. Parents were asked to immediately inform the Director's office in case of prolonged absence of their ward and promptly submit Medical Certificates for genuine illness.
- Recent incidents of student indiscipline and steps taken by the university to deal with such mishaps in future were discussed. Parents were asked to counsel their wards on the serious and severe consequences of such misconduct.

Director-Administration spoke on the recent additions to the infrastructure and other facilities for students in the campus. He also spoke on the need for discipline, and responsibility that has come with students being permitted to go out of the campus using the biometric monitoring systems at the gate.

- During the interaction session that followed and the parents wanted to know what steps the University was taking to keep pace with the rapidly changing

needs of the industry. The Director responded that the University has been bringing changes in the curriculum as and when the need arises and has been conducting workshops and conferences by experts from niche areas to keep the students prepared to face these challenges.

- Research projects and publication by students was also requested by parents.
- There was discussion on the soft skills and technical training being given to students to prepare them for placement. The status of the placement in the current outgoing batch and the plans for future batches of students was also touched upon.
- Problems with transport facility for the students were also discussed. Parents were asked to give representation to look in the matter.
- There was request from parents for more such interactions in the future.
- After the meeting, the parents met the faculty members to enquire about the academic progress of their wards.

such practices where the industry bends towards highly-funded Central and State government institutes would lead to a breakdown of the private education sector in the long run since a majority of graduates are from private institutes.

Statistics reveal that over 25% of government college graduates are unemployable.

At a panel discussion on 'Union Budget-2017', organised by ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education, Rangarajan said that though the adverse impact of demonetisation will wear off as currency availability improves, some effects will not go away even as sectors like real estate will have to rethink their business models.

"The banking system is undoubtedly under stress. How to resolve that, particular problem is only through capitalisation. Please remember, even in good old Base-I, the capital is 8 per cent of

the risk weighted assets. So, ₹10,000 crore (capital infusion to banks in 2017-18 as mentioned in the Budget) should not be compared with ₹1 lakh crore or ₹2 lakh crore," he said.

"I think that the general scene is that the capital provided is not adequate...I think this cannot let the banks escape the responsibility for the non-performing assets that they have in their asset portfolios.

"It is best to take steps to ensure that they collect as much as possible from the non-performing assets," Rangarajan said.

Hyderabad: Former Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor C Rangarajan on Monday said that real estate is one of the major sectors that will continue to reel under the heat of demonetisation in the near-term. "The adverse impact of demonetisation will wear off as currency availability approaches normalcy. But some effects will not go

away. Sectors like real estate will have to rethink how to run their businesses," the former RBI head said on the sidelines of a panel discussion on Union Budget-2017 here.

Meanwhile, speaking about the Budget, he said there was much expectation in relation to corporate tax. "But the finance minister has limited the reduction to 25% from 30% only to MSME companies. Though in terms of numbers MSME companies may dominate, this is not true in relation to output," he added.

According to him, the budget acted prudently to keep the fiscal deficit target at 3.2% of the GDP in 2017-18,

which is lower than 3.5% during the current fiscal and slightly higher than 3% which was indicated earlier.

Speaking on the issue of non-performing assets (NPAs), the former RBI chief said that banks have to control NPAs in their balance sheets. "The banking system is undoubtedly under stress. How to resolve that particular problem is only through capitalisation...I think that the general scene is that the capital provided is not adequate...I think this cannot let the banks escape the responsibility for the non-performing assets that they have in their asset portfolio," he said.
