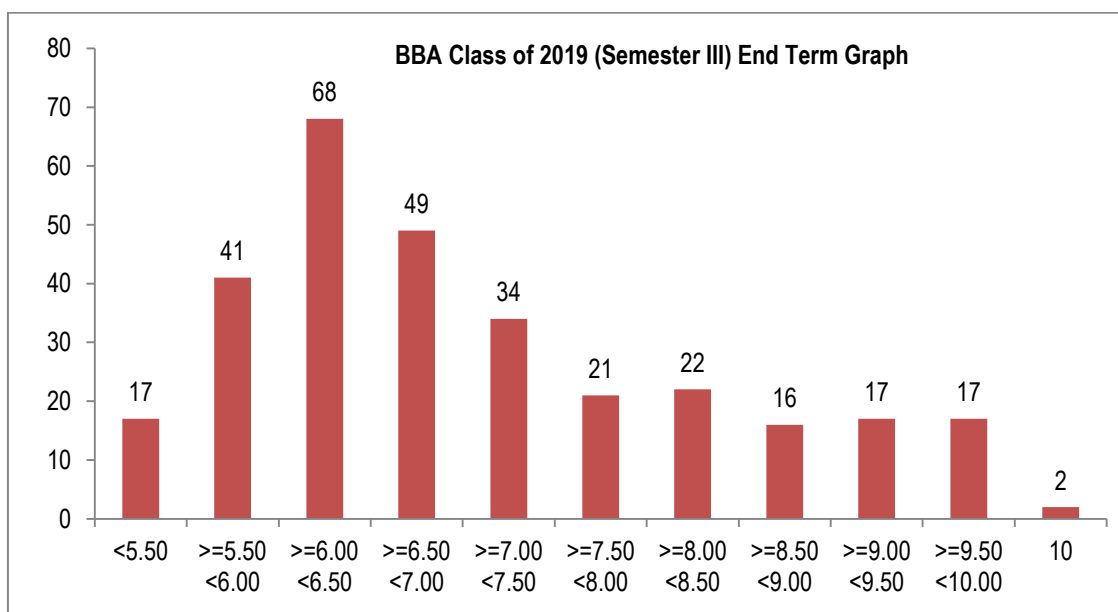

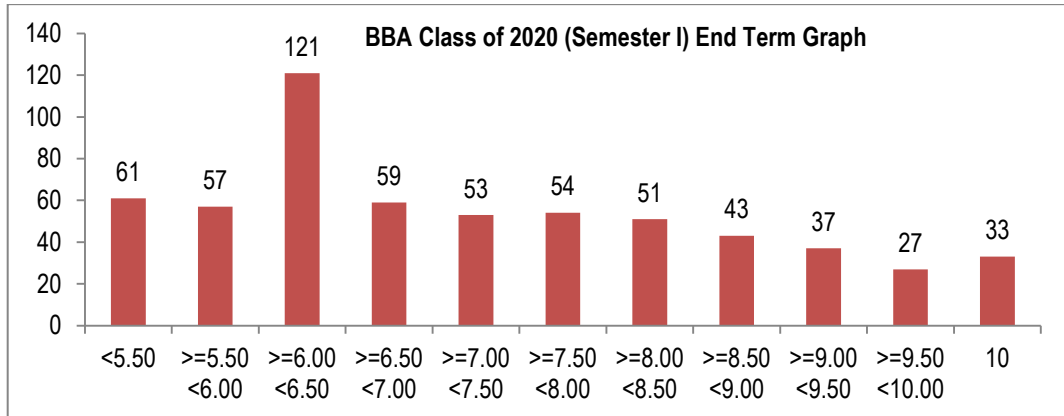

G. School of Social Sciences & Humanities

It was suggested by the UGC Expert Committee that we start the above school. We propose to start the School, to begin, with a Department of Economics. The School aims at imparting teaching and promoting implementation of practical aspects of Humanities and Social Sciences. It undertakes teaching and research programmes in the areas of Economics, Psychology, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology, English, Fine Arts and related inter-disciplinary subjects. From the academic year 2018-19, the school is starting a 3-Year B.A. (Economics) program.

Blending economics with traditional subjects like mathematics and statistics and the emerging areas like data science, the ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE) has come up with a new BA course in Economics.

"Graduates with economics are now sought-after as researchers, consultants, strategists and analysts in business, the shape of which is transforming every day with new businesses cropping up. And the amalgamation of this knowledge with science and technology subjects will provide great employment opportunities," says the IFHE Vice Chancellor, Prof. J. Mahender Reddy.

Prof. C. Rangarajan, former RBI Governor and former

adviser to the Prime Minister is the brain behind this course as he feels the relevance of the discipline will continue to increase, Prof. Reddy says.

The programme spread over six semesters and thirty six courses, spans across the

width of knowledge relevant to a bachelors' degree and it looks into various applications of Economics like public finance, trade, financial economics and environmental studies. While it amalgamates emerging areas of sciences, mathematics and computers, it also covers social science subjects such as political science, psychology, philosophy, logic, ethics, law and management. Prof. Reddy says students can specialise in econometrics or data science or entrepreneurship or financial economics. Internship and a thesis are mandatory.

The course fee is ₹50,000 per semester and those with 50% of marks in intermediate exams are eligible. Classes commence from July 16 and details can be had on 'www.ifheindia.org'.

Making India developed requires more than plugging leakages in tax system: Arvind Subramanian



The CEA address ICFE students about economic policy making in the Government

ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE) organized a lecture on November 24 on "Economic Policy Making in the Government". Dr. Arvind Subramanian, Chief Economic Adviser, Government of India, was the Chief Guest for the event which was presided over by Prof. J Mahender Reddy, Vice-Chancellor, IFHE.

In his lecture, Dr. Subramanian discussed the role of the Chief Economic Adviser in publishing Economic Survey of India and added that portions of it should form mandatory inputs in higher education.

He also highlighted the unique position India occupies in development studies. According to him, India achieved political development at the time of independence when it was still grappling with poverty. Redistribution of income therefore was important to reduce the problems of mass poverty and inequality. This is the reason why Indian growth policies need to accommodate such measures or subsidies.

"Universal Basic Income scheme in this alternative being thought about which will be a direct means of providing purchasing power for everyone. The mechanism for this is through linking Jan Dhan bank accounts with Aadhaar and mobile numbers. This linkage is expected to be a better and more foolproof method for targeting the poor for effective income redistribution," he said.

Further, about GST, Dr. Subramanian said that it was a great radical reform which was intended to increase voluntary compliance with tax laws. This also is, according to him, a novel cooperative exercise in federalism whereby the centre and the states can work together for the success of the federal spirit of the Constitution.

While answering a question on about whether removal of leakages from the tax system would make India developed, Dr. Subramanian said: "Making India a developed nation requires more than just closing leakages. The government should provide basic health, infrastructure, basic and higher education and higher investment that will help in the creation of jobs."

'GST on fuel: States' nod key'

Move will happen over time, with States' cooperation: CEA

Chief Economic Adviser Arvind Subramanian on Friday said going forward, there would be fewer GST rate slabs and petroleum products are to be brought under the Goods and Services Tax with the cooperation of the States.

"It will happen in the next few months and years ... and done cooperatively," he replied to a query on when petrol and diesel would come in the ambit of GST and whether States would agree to such a move.

The Petroleum Ministry had earlier written to the GST Council asking for petrol and diesel to be brought under the GST, something that may not go down well with the State governments as the VAT they levy on the fuel is a major revenue earner. Besides, the other sig-

nificant levy on petrol and diesel is the excise duty component. Bringing fuel under the GST is expected to reduce the pump price.

'One GST rate difficult'

Mr. Subramanian, who earlier in his lecture on 'Economic Policy Making in the Government' at the ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education here, said it was difficult to have one GST rate in a country like India, given that it would translate into taxing

essential commodities and luxury items at the same level. But the country is moving towards fewer rates, he said. "What we have done [is] collapsing the 28% rate so that it will only have items of luxury consumption. Then overtime, the 12% and 18% rate [slabs] can probably be collapsed into one rate. We will see fewer rates," he said.

"As we evolve and get comfortable with revenues, I think we will be looking at further simplification... over the next few months."

To another query on the proposal to change the financial year from April-March to January-December, he said no decision had been taken yet.

On the use of cryptocurrencies, he said bitcoins were banned and the government alone had the prerogative to issue currency.

Justice Chelameswar shares insights at ICFAI

Justice Chelameswar, Judge, Supreme Court of India said the legal education system has witnessed a paradigm shift. Speaking at a one day seminar on 'Legal Education and Profession - A Convergence today' at ICFAI University here, Justice Chelameswar said advancement of technology has proven that the need to have a photographic memory to make a good lawyer has become redundant.

He highlighted that present legal education system and its adequacy to train students to bring out the proposition of law to the facts is to be constantly achieved by the law schools to meet the emerging challenges of the legal system. He further stated that legal education should be designed in such a way that students be trained in areas which are desirable and new like environmental law, Intellectual Property Rights etc., suiting the needs of the legal system.

The Supreme Court Judge mentioned that there were discrepancies in the qualitative and teaching methods across various



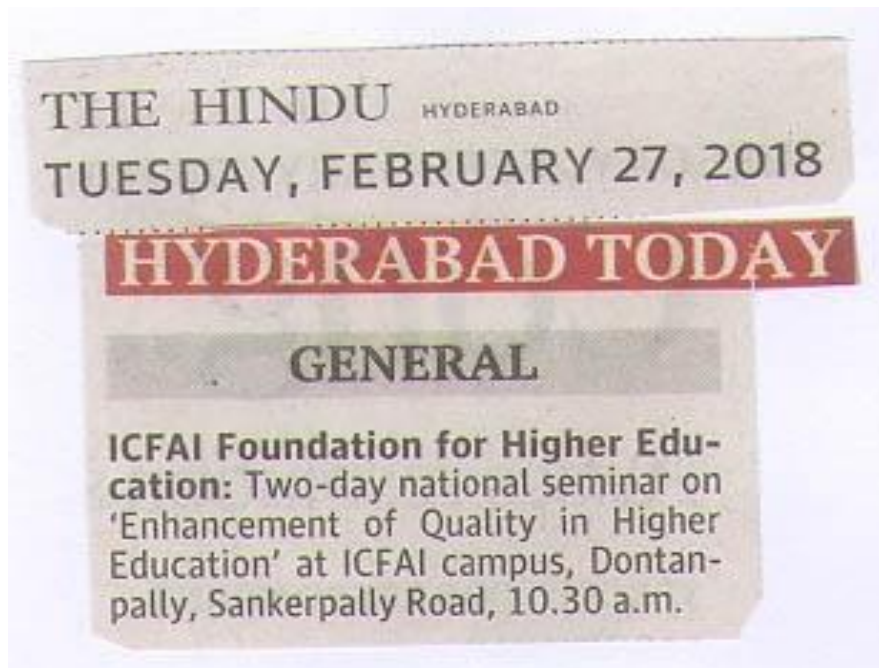
