#### **Preamble**

An Equal Opportunity Cell is constituted to look into the matters falling within its scope and recommend actions to the university authorities. The members of the committee meet periodically to formulate/revise guidelines and policies regarding discrimination, inequality, and other related matters (https://www.ifheindia.org/policy-prohibiting-discrimination), (https://www.ifheindia.org/anti-ragging-policy). The committee provides solutions and recommends actions.

#### **Prevention of Harassment**

The university has set up Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) in compliance with the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (https://www.ifheindia.org/Handbook-on-sexual-harassment-of-women-at-workplace.pdf). Any person having grievance of any kind of sexual harassment can be brought to the notice of this Committee for necessary action and redressal. Sexual harassment includes any unwelcome sexually determined behaviour such as physical contact and advances; a demand or request for sexual favours; sexually coloured remarks; showing pornography; any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature. Where any of these acts is committed in circumstances in relation to the victim's employment or work or course of study, whether he/she is drawing salary, or honorarium or voluntary or a student pursuing education, when the employee/student has reasonable grounds to believe that his/her objection would disadvantage his/her in connection with his/her employment or work or disrupt the course of study in the university including when it creates a hostile environment, adverse consequences might be visited if the victim does not consent to the conduct in question or raises any objection thereto – such conduct amount to sexual harassment.

The university has also set up an anti-ragging committee and anti-ragging squad (<a href="https://www.ifheindia.org/anti-ragging-policy">https://www.ifheindia.org/anti-ragging-policy</a>) to monitor and to keep a cheque on ragging on the campus. Any physical/mental harassment towards fellow students including ragging, quarrelling, using abusive language and violent behaviour is strictly prohibited.
