Mr. Lakshmikumaran shared a short story about the importance of the teacher-student relationship. Sharing a Mahabharata episode, he explained how Dronacharya told Duryodhana that the day he would fight with Arjuna would be his last day. "When Duryodhana questioned him, he said as a

teacher who had trained him I know that he is better than me," he explained. "That is what every teacher will have to try. They should strive to make students who are better than their gurus."

Dr. C Rangarajan, Chancellor of the University, who presided said that better education brings in quality, which results in better development of the country. He emphasised the three dimensions of education - access, equality and quality. He said, "A teacher will convey; A good teacher will communicate; but, a great teacher will inspire the students".
